I Mary Welch of the County of Jefferson and State of Kentucky
being weak in body but of sound mind and disposing memory do make
constitute and ordain the following my last will and testament
I give and bequeath to John Rowan Jones son of Col John Jones my
little milch cow Hans Dick, who is to pass into the possession of said
Col John Jones immediately after my death for the use and bene-
fit of the said John Rowan Jones
I give and bequeath to Jacob Augustus son of Capt David
Augustus my bay horse, which horse is to be delivered to said Jacob
Augustus immediately after my death. I direct that my executor
sell or cause to be sold as soon as convenient the whole residue of my
estate both real and personal on a credit of twelve months and
that out of the money arising from said sale he pay to my brother
Henry Lewis four hundred dollars so soon as he shall
have collected that amount and that the balance of the money
after paying all my just debts be equally divided between William
Keyser son of my brother John Keyser dect and the oldest child
of my brother Stephen Keyser, which money is to be paid to them
by my Executor when they arrive at the age of twenty one
years and not before.

I do hereby constitute and appoint my friend
Col John Jones Executor of this my last will and testament And
I do hereby cloth him with him with full power and authority
to do execute the same without giving security of any kind.
