

Ex^t Be it remembered that I Mary White of Jefferson County being weak in body but of sound and perfect mind and memory do make and publish this my last will and testament in manner and form following - That is to say -

1st I give and bequeath to my son William White my negro woman Quannah and her two youngest children viz. Adam and Bob for and during his life time. And at his death I give and bequeath the said negroes with the future increase of the said woman Quannah unto my grand son Lee White to him and his heirs forever.

2nd I give and bequeath unto my Grand Children descendents of my son George White dec^d viz. William G White, Lucindy White, Mary White, Elizabeth White, Sally Stover, Robert White and Anna White four negro slaves viz. a man named John, a deaf and dumb boy named Ned and a woman named Violet and her child named Margaret to them and their heirs forever to be equally divided amongst them in any way my Executors hereafter named shall think equitable. But the said William G White may at his election any time within three years after my death by paying into the hands of my Executors hereafter to be named the sum of Six hundred and fifteen dollars current money take to himself the aforesaid man named John and boy named Ned. And in case of such election and payment then my said Executors are hereby directed and it is my will and desire that the said negro man named John and boy Ned be by them delivered over to the said Wm G White in his own right and his heirs and assigns forever.

In the mean time my Executors are to hire out the said Slaves
for the best price that can be obtained taking into consideration
convenience, humanity and good treatment.

And the said Mary White may at her election any time within
three years after my death by paying into the hands of my Execu-
tors hereafter to be named the sum of three hundred and fourteen
dollars current money take to herself the aforesaid woman Violet
and her child named Margaret. And in case of such election and
payment, then my said Executors are hereby directed and it is my
will and desire that the said negro woman Violet and her child
Margaret and any other child or children she may then have
be by them delivered over to the said Mary White in her own right
and her heirs and assigns forever.

And the proceeds of the hire aforesaid after paying all just charges
to be equally divided and paid over to the said children of my
son George dec^d as also the aforesaid sums of six hundred and
fifteen dollars and three hundred and fourteen dollars. The
first sum of six hundred and fifteen dollars to be equally
divided amongst all of my said Grand children and paid to
them as they arrive at the age of twenty one years, except Wil-
liam G White of which he is to have no part. The second sum viz
three hundred and fourteen dollars to be equally divided amongst
all of my said Grand children and paid to them as they become
of the age of twenty one years, except the said Mary White who

three years after my death by paying into the hands of my Executors hereafter to be named the sum of three hundred and fourteen dollars current money take to herself the aforesaid woman Violet and her child named Margaret. And in case of such election and payment, then my said Executors are hereby directed and it is my will and desire that the said negro woman Violet and her child Margaret and any other child or children she may then have be by them delivered over to the said Mary White in her own right and her heirs and assigns forever.

And the proceeds of the hire aforesaid after paying all just charges to be equally divided and paid over to the said children of my son George dec^d as also the aforesaid sums of six hundred and fifteen dollars and three hundred and fourteen dollars. The first sum of six hundred and fifteen dollars to be equally divided amongst all of my said Grand children and paid to them as they arrive at the age of twenty one years, Except William B White of which he is to have no part. The second sum viz three hundred and fourteen dollars to be equally divided amongst all of my said Grand children and paid to them as they become of the age of twenty one years, except the said Mary White who is to have no part of it.

3rd I give and bequeath unto my daughter Nancy Batthrope my negro girl named Mary to her heirs and assigns forever. Also all my chairs, one bed and furniture, one table, one chest, my cupboards and cupboard ware, one pot, one oven and teakettle, also one cow

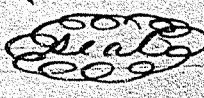
and calf.

4th. It is my will that my negro woman Lucy and all the remaining part of my property be disposed of in the way my Executors may deem to the best advantage, And after paying all just debts and demands against my estate and after paying to my daughter Mary Lloyd the sum of ten pounds, which I give and bequeath unto her, that the ballance be equally divided between my grand daughters Winney Balthrop, Eliza Lloyd, Eliza J White and Mary M White and my great grand daughter Mary Jane Glass and her brother Robt William Glass and paid to them as they shall arrive at the age of twenty one years.

Lastly I do appoint my son William White and grand son Geo White Executors of this my last will and testament hereby revoking all others heretofore made.
