

I Mathias Love of the State of Kentucky do hereby
 constitute this my last will and testament this 4th day of May 1829
 It is my will that the plantation I at present live on with all the ad-
 joining purchases of small tracts of land that I have a deed too and
 adjoining whereon I live being about 100 acres be equally divided
 both as to quality and improvement and value and that George R.
 Love have the one half thereof and that my daughter Rebecca Owen
 and her heirs have the other half with the exception of one half acre
 of land which are to be laid off and around where I have at present
 a burring ground which are not to be divided or sold, but are to re-
 main in the hands of my sons and their survivors forever as a burring
 for myself or such of my relatives as may wish to be placed there
 And further it is my will that all my farming utensils and all
 my stock of every kind and species with all my crops of corn, wheat
 &c that I have in hand at my death, with all my household
 furniture of every description and every thing not here mentioned that
 might not possibly come under the denomination of household furni-
 ture. It is my will that it should be divided into four equal allot-
 ments as to value, either by themselves or by ones chosen by them
 and that each of my children to wit: George R. Love, Betsy Rayburn
 Rebecca Owen and Eliza Sist do each of them have one equal allot-
 ment of said property, As to all the residue of my property or interest
 of any property that may be in me at the time of my death
 I will and bequeath in the following manner to wit: the half acre lot
 that Doctor Sist at present live on in Louisville with the improvements
 thereon I will and bequeath to my daughter Eliza who is married
 to J. D. P. Sist

thereon I will and bequeath to my daughter Eliza with an interest
 with W. R. Gist with an equal interest in all other property of every descrip-
 tion not heretofore devised to George and Rebecca my money, bonds and
 covenants for money or property that may be on hand and due me, with
 any claims that I may have for stock in any corporate body, also the follow-
 ing negroes George, Amy his wife with all their children and grandchildren
 great grand children should they have any, with the exception of Minnie
 and her youngest child that she may have at my death which I will
 to be free and declared them so. And to my daughter Betsey who intermarries
 with Nathaniel Hagland I will and bequeath the following negroes, Am-
 drew, Milly his wife, their or either of their children or grand children,
 Flora and all her children, Smoot, Lucy his wife with their children, with
 exception of Harry which I will to be free, declare him so at my death, also
 the one equal moiety of all my debts, monies heretofore described, the
 other equal moiety having been devised to my daughter Eliza. This my will
 that all the crops that may be in the ground at my death go with the
 land to George and Rebecca. All debts that I may owe at the time of my
 death and funeral expenses are to be paid out of the property or money
 heretofore devised to my daughter Eliza Gist, Betsey Hagland, further
 I not have erected a stone wall around my grave yard at my death, the same
 are to be put up at the expenses and out of the devise made to my daughter
 Betsey & Eliza to be about 30 feet square and about four feet high and
 no openings therein as they would subject the wall to fall.
 I will all interest that I may have in Sally which came to me by the
 of my daughter Sally to Eliza Gist. I also appoint my sons in law
 W. R. Gist and Nathl. Hagland my Executors
 Given under my hand this day and year before written
 Matthew
