At a County Court held for Jefferson County  
at the Court house in the City of Louisville on the fifth day of  
September 1831

An Instrument of writing purporting to be the  
last will and testament of Molly Ann Luckett dec<sup>d</sup> State of this  
County and a Codicil thereto annexed was produced in Court  
and proved by the oath of Hugh W Holloway a subscribing  
witness to the same, it was also proved that M<sup>r</sup> Miller a sub-  
scribing witness to said will is out of this State, that he subscribed  
the same in the presence of said Molly Ann Luckett and said  
Holloway and thereupon the said will and Codicil were estab-  
lished to be the last will and testament and Codicil of said  
Molly Ann Luckett and ordered to be recorded.

And on the motion of John Jones Clerk  
and Elizabeth Moore Executrix named in said will who made  
oath according to law execution thereof was granted them  
not binding them to give security

I Molly Anne Luckett of the County of Jefferson and State of Kentucky, being of sound mind and memory do make, declare and publish this my last will and testament and do dispose of and devise away my estate as follows. First After my debts and funeral expences are paid I give and devise to my Grand daughter Sarah L. Christon a negro woman named Senny as slave for life and that my daughter Eliza N. Moore is to have the management of said negro woman and shall hire her out to the best possible advantage for the use of the said Sarah L. Christon until the said Sarah shall marry, should she move from Louisville or farther than twelve miles surrounding, then the said Sarah is not to take away said woman nor is she to be sent out of the family.

I Give and devise to my daughter Eliza N. Moore as slave for life a negro man named Charles and a negro woman named Molly, She the said Eliza shall pay over to such person as may have the care of my two Grand daughters Catharine and Elizabeth Luckett (daughters of Samuel N. Luckett) one half of the value of the hire of said Charles and Molly per annum for five years, at the expiration of which time the said Eliza is to have the whole of the aforesaid two slaves.

I give and devise to my Grand daughter Mary N. Moore a negro man named Frank as slave for life, my daughter

I give and devise to my Grand daughter Mary A. Moore a negro man named Frank as slave for life, my daughter Eliza A. Moore to have the management of the said negro man Frank until the said Mary shall marry, then if she settles here she is to have entire possession of said negro Frank, tho he is not to be separated from his family, should she move more than twelve miles from this place (Louisville).

I give and devise to my Grand son Roland M. Luckett son of Samuel A. Luckett a negro man named George as a slave for life by the said Roland M. Luckett paying to my Grand daughter Sarah L. Thurston One hundred dollars in specie as follows. twenty five dollars every six months until it shall amount to the said One hundred dollars. And in the event of the said Sarah L. Thurston removing from this state before the said One hundred dollars shall have been paid the said Roland M. Luckett shall pay up to the said Sarah the balance of the said One hundred dollars that may be due at the time she may migrate and that he shall pay to my Executors and executrix the sum of thirty dollars in specie which sum they shall lay out in a half dozen of silver tea spoons and a half dozen of large silver table spoons and have engraved on each spoon the letters M. A. L. and then deliver or send the same to my Grand daughter Mary Eliza Conway.

I give and devise to my Grand son George F. Moore my gold watch.

I give and devise to my great Grand son Thomas Roland Conway and John Middleton Moore

I give and devise to my grandson John M. Luckett a negro man named George as a slave for life by the said Noland Mc Luckett paying to my Grand daughter Sarah L. Thurston One hundred dollars in specie as follows. twenty five dollars every six months until it shall amount to the said One hundred dollars. And in the event of the said Sarah L. Thurston removing from this state before the said One hundred dollars shall have been paid the said Noland Mc Luckett shall pay up to the said Sarah the balance of the said One hundred dollars that may be due at the time she may migrate and that he shall pay to my Executors and Executrix the sum of thirty dollars in specie which sum they shall lay out in a half dozen of silver tea spoons and a half dozen of large silver table spoons and have engraved on each spoon the letters M A L and then deliver or send the same to my Grand daughter Mary Eliza Conway

I give and devise to my Grand son George H. Moore my gold watch.

I give and devise to my great Grand son Thomas Noland Conway and John Middleton Moore my Grand son all my right, title and interest in and to the sum plus land at Noland's Ferry in Loudoun County Virginia which was willed to me by my father, the other legatees having received their proportion of the same I wish my Executors and Executrix to write to Virginia and have it attended

They may make any disposition of it which will in their opinion be most advantageous to the aforesaid Thomas Roland and John Middleton.

I have two notes of hand executed by my son Craven Pluckett to me for the payment of upwards six hundred dollars and I do devise and give to my Grand daughter Sarah L. Thruston one half of the amount of the said notes, which I request my son Craven Pluckett to pay the same to the said Sarah in any way she may think proper to receive it, the other half I devise to Christopher B. Pluckett my Grand son, the payment of which shall be left to the discretion of his father C. B. Pluckett.

I give and bequeath to my Grand daughter Mary Ann Pluckett a negro woman Violet and her son James as slaves for life and that my daughter in law Susan Pluckett is to have the use of said woman and child until the said Mary Ann Pluckett shall marry, then she is to have the entire benefit of them.

I hold two notes one on James Atkinson and the other on Thomas Woods, which notes I devise and give to my daughter Eliza A. Woods, then being for the hire of my negroes Charles and Molly for the present year, as a remuneration for her care and attention to me.

It is my wish that my Grand daughter Sarah L. Thruston shall have such part of my clothing as she may choose to take and the balance to be divided between negro girl Peggy and negro woman Polly. I devise to my Grand daughter Susan Pluckett the sum of \$1000.

I devise to my Grand son James Francis and John S. Moore &  
negro woman named Rachel and her increase, my title in  
said woman Rachel will be found in the Clerk's Office in a  
mortgage from Craven & Luckett to me and now the devising and  
disposing of my little estate, (which I am sorry is reduced so low)  
in the most equitable manner in my judgement. I do most sol-  
emnly invoke my dear children to live in peace and harmony,  
to cherish and support the most cordial and affectionate feelings  
towards each other and further entreat and earnestly desire  
(which will be the surest guarantee to the continuance of their uni-  
ty love and good will to each other) that they shall embrace  
the true principles of the holy religion, and live up and accor-  
ding to its principles, which is the prayer of their sincere and  
affectionate old mother and Grand mother. Lastly, I consti-  
tute and appoint my daughter Eliza S. Moore Executrix,  
and John Jones Esq of this my last will and testament, hereby  
revoking all other wills by me heretofore made and declaring  
this only to be my true will and testament, In Witness whereof  
I hereunto set my hand and affix my seal this thirteenth  
day of July in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred  
and thirty one.
