James Williams of the County of Jefferson and State of Kentucky
do make and ordain this my last will and testament as follows
after all my just and lawful debts are paid; I do bequeath the
residue of all my real and personal estate to my beloved wife
Nancy to have and to hold during her natural life and after
her death to be equally divided among three of my children
viz. Betsey, Sam and John Williams, as I think I have given the
rest of my children as much or more than I shall leave to the
