

The last will and testament of Nicholas Broghant

The experience of every person who has been afflicted with the human existence, the most delicate health and constitution are not infrequently shared for many years. Knowing this and wishing with certainty to exercise the right which our Country has given of leaving our property to those who are dearest to us we to those in whose hands it may be most beneficial and necessary. Therefore

I, Nicholas Broghant of Jefferson County State of Kentucky do make and ordain the following as my last and lawful will.

I give to my dearest brother Charles my tract of land of 300 acres nearly opposite the Sixth mile Saluda County on Rays fork of Big Warren River together with all my present property in Louisville and 1250 acres of land in Warren County on Rays fork of Big Warren River together with all my present property.

I give to my nephew George Broghant 5 tracts of land on Big Warren River near Bowling Green containing together 1505 acres including two large bends in the River.

I give to my niece Angelica Broghant 830 acres on Claylick fork of Little Warren River and 125 acres on Little Warren called the horse shoe bend.

To my dear Sister Ann H Jessup I give 900 acres of land in Warren Ky, including the Hogg Lick Sycamore Spring a branch of Hogg Creek and all my land in the State of Indiana.
To my dear brother George I give all my land in the State of Indiana.

To my dear Sister Ann H Jessup I give 900 acres of land in
Warren Co, including the Hog Lick Sycamore Spring a branch of
Snake Creek and all my land in the State of Indiana.

To my dear brother George I give all my property not mentioned
in this my will. I hereby appoint Charles and George and Bent
my Executors to this my will.
