

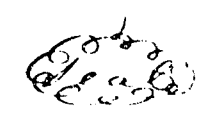

declare this to be my last will and testament in manner and
form following that is to say.

in and to the house in which I now reside and the

Also all my right title and interest of, in and to the Stable lately erected by me on the lot which I leased from Hbr William Croughan fronting on Market Street. Also all my right title and interest of, in and to the following described personal property To wit: three horses, one gig and harness, two saddles and two bridles, all the household and kitchen furniture, wearing apparel, watches, jewelry &c which I now may own or do seized and possessed of.

It is my will and desire after all my necessary funeral expenses shall be paid that all my just personal debts shall be paid. Lastly, I hereby nominate, constitute and appoint my dearly beloved wife Catharine Morris Executrix of this my last will and testament and respectfully request that the Worshipful the County Court of Jefferson County will not require security of her in administering on my estate. ^{For Witnesses whereof I haveunto set my hand and seal} on this Eleventh day of July One thousand eight hundred and thirty three
