forever - And finally that my will may be finally settled
and no further take place. I do hereby nominate and
appoint my son Abel Covington my whole Executor of this
my last and testament. and I do by these presents
disannul make void and relinquish all former wills
heretofore made by me. and declare this to be my last
will and Testament. Given under my hand and seal
