by me. It is my will and desire that my beloved daughters Sally
Hancock and Katy Shraeder have all my wearing clothes and that
they be divided equally between them.
It is further my will and desire that my daughter Katy
Shraeder have my husoo.
It is also my will and desire that the balance of my estate be
equally divided between my sons Henry Harding
and Katy Shraeder to be divided in that way they may see proper

The within instrument of writing was produced in Court and proved to be the last will and testament of Rebecca Harding deceased by the oaths of Hancock and Serrel two of the subscribing witnesses thereto and ordered to be recorded and is recorded. And on the motion of William Hancock who made oath according to law, Administrator of the estate with the will annexed of the said Rebecca Harding was granted him. Whereupon he gave bond with Nathan Angle his security (who justified in the penalty of three hundred dollars conditioned according to law
