ing property; My Executors ^{they} to have the Guidance, Guardianship and
protection and the receiving and expenditure of his money and the
laying it out in such a manner as that it may be getting something
to the best advantage until he arrives to forty years of age, then
my will and desire is that they fairly account to him for the £300
pounds and for his services up to that day, then give him an abso-
lute deed of manumission, pay him his dues and let him do what
he pleases. I hope they will still continue to befriend and assist him.

And my will and desire is that my Executors
have three years to account with my Representatives or others
to whom I direct and direct payments hereafter, in that time
I direct that my property be made the most off by selling all
that is perishable and giving as long a credit as this three years
will admit. By obtaining deeds and patents for my lands due on
bond and located in the Land Office and determining all suits
that may be brought for or against me.

After the end of three years my will is that my Executors
divide my estate equally between my children.

After the end of three years my will is that my Executors divide my estate equally to my brother and four sisters, share and share alike To wit: Thomas Jones Water, Mary Water, Benjamin Jones Water, Rachel James Water and Ann Jones Water to them, their heirs, Executors, Administrators, or assigns.

Item My will is that no letter of administration be taken out as in the ordinary cases but that my Executors go on to administer, collect, pay out and expend to the best advantage keeping regular and proper accounts of all such transactions and rendering the same on oath to my afore mentioned brother, to be by him examined and full receipts to be given on behalf of himself and his sisters and if he or his representatives should refuse to pay and receipt for such accounts, then my will is that the matter of dispute between him and my Executors be referred to two honest, disinterested men, one chosen by himself the other by my Executors and their award with the assistance of an umpire if necessary to close all accounts between my said brother and my Executors.

Note. I expect my Executors will write to my brother and that he and they will attend at Bardonia for the purpose of a final settlement at some time that my Executors may appoint giving him six months notice.

Lastly. I constitute and appoint my friends John Munday and Thomas Freeman my Executors.

Third, their heirs, Executors, Administrators or assigns.

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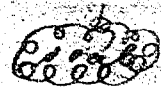
