testament in the manner and form following

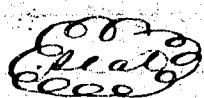
I first revive my soul to God and my body to the earth to be decent-

boy Armistead, one feather bed and furniture one cow and calf.

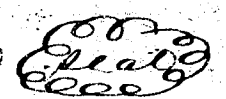
I give and bequeath to my daughter Mary Briscoe my negro girl
Minney, one bed and furniture, one cow and calf.

I give and bequeath to my affectionate wife Mary Briscoe all the
residue of my slaves and estate, whatever I may be seized and pos-
sessed of either real, personal or mixed. And Lastly I do hereby nominate
constitute and appoint my dear wife Mary Briscoe to be sole Execu-
trix of this my last will and testament, hereby revoking all other wills
by me heretofore made, ratifying this and only this my last will and
testament. In Testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and
affixed my seal this fifteenth day of July in the year of our Lord

of August 1822. The within instrument of writing was produced in
Court and proved to be the last will and testament of Robert
Briscoe by the oaths of John Le Bevier and Henry Briscoe, and
ordered to be recorded and is recorded in my office as Clerk of the
said Court. And on the motion of Mary Briscoe widow of Robert
Briscoe deceased late of this County, who made oath according
to law, execution of the last will and testament of Robert Briscoe
deceased is granted her, whereupon she gave bond John Le Bevier
Henry Briscoe and James Briscoe Securities in the penalty of four
thousand dollars conditioned according to law
