I ~~do~~ ^{do} give and devise to my wife Charlotte all my real
and personal property of whatever nature or kind it may be, Con-
sisting of the house and lot whereon I now live, accounts, notes
for and during the term of her natural life and after her death
it is my will and desire that the said property shall devolve to and be-
long to Richmond Julia Ann, Clarin, Felix, Ellen and Washington
Pitts children of Archbold Pitts of the County of Nelson and Thomas
Pelly, Sally, Kitty, Sherlotte, Children of Thomas Pitts also of Nelson
County and be divided equally between them, after deducting the
sum of one hundred dollars, which I hereby give and devise
to Eleanor Aull my half sister, which sum is to be paid to the
said Eleanor Aull after the death of my said wife.

If my said wife should marry, it is my will and desire that
the property hereby lent to her during her life, shall not be
enjoyed by the person whom she may marry, nor subject to his con-
trol or directions but that it shall still be and remain in her
possession and to her use for the said term of her natural life.

I hereby appoint my said wife whole and sole Executrix of
this my last will and testament.
