I Sally Jones of Jefferson County and
State of Kentucky, being sick and weak in body, but of sound dis-
posing mind and memory, thanks be to God And knowing that is man
appointed for all flesh to die, do make and Ordain this my last will
and testament in form as follows To Wit:

First I give and bequeath unto John Robert Lawes, Sally Ann Lawes,
Andrew Jackson Lawes and Eleanor Elizabeth Lawes children of my
brother William S. Lawes, the house and lot that I bought of William
Chambers, the same that William S. Lawes now resides in Middle town
to them and their heirs forever.

Secondly I give and bequeath unto Sally Ann Lawes daughter of
William S. Lawes named Isaac to her and her heirs forever, also one
bed and furniture to her and her heirs forever.

Thirdly I give unto Eleanor Elizabeth Lawes daughter of William
S. Lawes one negro boy named Sam to her and her heirs forever.

Fourthly I give and bequeath unto the four above mentioned children
of William S. Lawes the following negroes To Wit: Legs, Philip and
Sarah to them and their heirs forever. Also all the residue of my
property of whatsoever kind it may be to be equally divided be-
tween them And in case either of the said children should die
before they arrive to the age of maturity, the negroes and other
property shall descend to the surviving children.

I Acknowledge this to be my last will and testament, re-
voking all other wills heretofore made. In testimony hereunto
I have set my hand and affixed my seal this 26 Day of April 1840

and her children to her and her heirs forever
Wholly. I give unto Elian & Elizabeth Lawes daughters of William
& James one negro boy named Sam to her and her heirs forever.
Fourthly. I give and bequeath unto the four above mentioned children
of William & James the following negroes To wit: Legs, Philip and
Sarah to them and their heirs forever. Also all the residue of my
property of whatsoever kind it may be to be equally divided be-
tween them And in case either of the said children should die
before they arrive to the age of maturity, the negroes and other
property I shall decend to the surviving children.

I Acknowledge this to be my last will and testament, re-
voking all other wills heretofore made. In testimony hereunto
I have set my hand and affixed my seal this 26 Day of April 1811
