I Samuel Lewellen of Louisville Kentucky, being fully aware that I am nearly approaching the grave and being greatly desirous to settle my worldly concerns do make this as my last will and testament

I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Sally Lewellen all my beds and furniture, consisting of one feather bed, two Cotton Sheets, two case blankets and one three point blanket, bolster and pillows, five quilts, Also two straw beds and two bedsteads, one line split bottom chair, two tables, one chest and two trunks and also all the kitchen furniture now belonging to me. Also I own sixty seven acres of land in Virginia Monongahela County being part of four hundred acres patented to me by the Commonwealth of Virginia. And it being my wish and desire that my said wife should have a part of said land I do hereby give and bequeath to her my said beloved wife and third part of said sixty seven acres of land to her and her heirs forever.

I have a claim to some land adjoining Louisville which has been in dispute between me and John Dougherty deceased it is also my will that my said wife should have one third part of said claim to her and to her heirs forever.

I give and bequeath the rest and remaining part of my said land and the claim before mentioned to my children Nancy Walton, Spira, Thomas W. Sewell, Catherine Riggs, Mary Everett and Samuel R. Sewell to be equally divided between them.

Now, I own Sixty seven acres of land in Virginia a Monongahela
County being part of four hundred acres patented to me by
the Commonwealth of Virginia. And it being my wish and
desire that my said wife should have a part of said land I
do hereby give and bequeath to her my said beloved wife one
third part of said Sixty seven acres of land to her and her
heirs forever.

I have a claim to some land adjoining Louisville
which has been in dispute between me and Mr. Dougherty deceased
it is also my will that my said wife should have one third
part of said claim to her and to her heirs forever.

Now, I give and bequeath the rest and remaining part of my
said land and the claim before mentioned to my children Nancy
Walter, Susan, Thomas H. Sewall, Catherine Riggs, Mary Everett
and Samuel R. Sewall to be equally divided between them.

Lastly I hereby appoint my wife Patty executrix and Ward
McCallister Executor to this my last will and testament.

Having thus finished my last will and testament, I commend
my soul to God who is my Redeemer and Saviour, revoking
all other will heretofore made by me

Published by the Testator as his last
will and testament in our presence
who at his request signed our names
as Witnesses to the same.
