

and 6 On the name of God Amen, I Amos W Shaw of Louisville
Kentucky, being weak in body, but sound in mind and memory
and knowing the uncertainty of life do make, ordain and publish
this as my last will and testament.

First. I commit my remains for interment to the discretion of my
Executors hereinafter named.

Second. I will and desire that all my just debts and funeral
charges be paid so soon after my decease as may be convenient.

Third. I hereby return to my beloved wife Catharine all the
estate and property which I received and got by her on and
after my marriage of every kind whatever. I will and devise
that my Executors purchase and procure of A. H. Overitt a
gig and harness for which I appropriate three hundred
and fifty dollars, which sum shall be so applied by my Ex-
ecutors so soon as the same can be done without injury to my estate
and said gig and harness to be purchased by my Executors
shall be delivered to my said wife for her use and benefit.

Fourth. I give and devise to my brother Amos Shaw five hun-
dred dollars in money to be paid to him so soon as the same
can be conveniently done by my Executors, and in like manner
two hundred and fifty dollars to Amos Shaw, son of
David Shaw, the last to be invested by my Executors in land
in some Western non-slave holding estate for the said Amos.

Fifth. I will and devise that my negro boy Frank shall be
sent to Liberia, whenever his mother or any of his brother and
sisters now owned by A. H. Overitt may be sent, and if none
of them can be sent, then to be sent to Liberia.

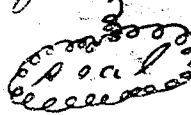
sent to Liberia, whenever his mother or any of his brothers and sisters now owned by Mr. Beveridge may be sent, and if none of them are sent by the time he arrives to the age of twenty five years, he is then to be sent if he is willing to go. And if he is willing he is to be sent upon his expenses home and fifty dollars in money, paid him on his arrival at Liberia. And until he arrives at twenty five or until he shall be sent to Liberia, I will and direct that he be hired out to some judicious, humane person, who will be willing to prepare him for that colony: But if he shall not choose to go when called to do so, he shall be hired out the balance of his life or until he shall be willing to go to Liberia for the benefit of the American Colonization Society.

Sixth. I give to the American Colonization Society the sum of thirty dollars and to the American Home Missionary Society the sum of Ten dollars and Ten dollars to the American Sunday School Society.

Seventh. Being well aware that my brother William Shaw of Newburyport is well provided for and on that account whatever I may have to give, he would prefer it given to those of my relatives who require my aid and hereby assuring my said brother of my unabated fraternal regard I exclude him for the above reason only and do make bequeath the rest and residue of my estate real, personal and mixed to my other brothers and Sisters, not knowing precisely what each ones share may be, I do hereby devise whatever may be the portions of my estate to my

~~best to invest the shares of each in Bonds Stock or real estate. And if~~
the same shall be on hand at the death of my said Sisters or either
of them the share of the one so dying shall go and descend to
their child or children in equal proportions. It being my meaning
to invest said Trustees with all necessary discretionary power for
the use of my said Sisters and their children
Eighth. I constitute and appoint Nathaniel Hardy and Samuel
Elles Jun my Executors to carry into full effect this my last
will and testament
