I Samuel Blankenbaker being of sound mind, do hereby as my last will and testament bequeath One half of this property, being fifty two and 1/2 feet on Jefferson and Hancock Streets to my wife for her life time and after her decease to my son Wm. Frederick Blankenbaker, the other half to be sold to pay my debts. My brothers James and Jeremiah to be administrators of the aforesaid A.D. Twenty six feet 3 inches front on Jefferson Street running back One hundred and two feet is the property of my brother Thomas in fee simple, to be taken off the lower line of the above mentioned property.

In case my son Wm. Frederick should die without heirs or before he becomes of age the property left him is to become the property of my Sister Mary viz after the decease of my wife
