I covenant and resign my soul to God who gave it with a lively hope of a blessed immortality and require my executors hereafter to be appointed to have my body buried in a decent and Christian like manner.

To my niece Sarah Ann Bower fifty dollars.

To my niece Mary Vance Bower fifty dollars.

All the balance of my property after paying my just debts I wish to be equally divided betwixt my sister Mary Vance and my brother Joseph Glass. I appoint my brothers Robert D Vance of Virginia, Joseph Glass of Kentucky and Samuel Glass of Kentucky executors of this my last will and testament.

the Court house in Louisville on the 10th day of December 1831

The within instrument of writing was proved to be the last will
and testament of the within named Sarah Glass by the oaths of
Basib H. Hobbs and James Rudy two of the subscribing witnesses
therein and ordered to be recorded and is recorded in my Office
and on the motion of Joseph Glass and Saml Vance Executors therein
named and who made oath according to law, Execution of the said
will was granted them, Whereupon they gave bond with Basib
H. Hobbs and Levi Tyler their Securities in the penalty of three
thousand dollars Conditioned according to law

forever. I give to Edward Garland my son in law my land in Hen-
rington, bought of Hancock Lee to him and his heirs forever.
My will is that all the land I am entitled to in the County of
Louisa be sold to the highest bidder and the proceeds thereof be
divided equally between my son James Maury and my son in law
