arising from the rents of the same plantation to be equally
divided between my three children Priscilla and James
& said Lucia and my personal property also to be
equally divided among my children but to remain

last will and Testament of Stephen Stewart deceased was
produced in Court and proved by the oath of James Stewart

divided ^{between} my two sons begotten of my present wife
Peggy Wright. I also give to my wife all my movable
property and oblige the said Peggy Wright to
the children of my first wife as follows. Item I
to my Daughter Sally twenty Dollars two years
after date then I give my son William a horse &
give him one Dollar & no more. My son Richard
left me two years before he came to Louisville &
therefore give him one dollar and no more my
