being in a low state of bodily health but of a
perfect and sound mind do make and
ordain this my last will and testament
in manner and form following -

and the sum of one hundred pounds
(to be paid by my Executors) —

Item 5th I Give and bequeath to my two
youngest daughters (daughters of my son
John) one negro girl named Annie
to them and their heirs forever (which negro
is now in the possession of my
son John Bates) —

Item 6th I Give unto my son John Bates my
Mohogany Case and one silver soup spoon.

Item 7th I Give and bequeath to my Daughter
Catharine Wager one negro woman named
Ann and her increase (viz, one boy named
Henry one girl named Sarah one do named
Jenny one do named Dianna one do named
Vichey one do named Fanny one negro boy
named George one do named Abram
them and their heirs forever —

I do by this my last will & Testament nominate
and appoint John Decker and my son James
S Bates Executors to this my last will, and
revoke all other wills heretofore made. In

and seal this 6th day of November in the
year of our Lord 1806

were present in the time of the last will of
Thomas Cecil late of Louisville

during her natural life two hundred acres
of land being one equal moiety of a half
four hundred acres which I purchased
my sons John & James ~~Bates~~ and at her
death I give the same to my Grand Daugh-
ter, Elizabeth D Lock her heirs as of right
for ever I also give unto my Daughter
Ann Lock the sum of one hundred and twenty
sea pounds now in the hands of her husband
John D Lock, also the further sum of seventy
three pounds to be paid to her by my Executors
also my riding Horse and saddle
Item I Give and bequeath (in trust)
to my son James S Bates for the use &
benefit of my Daughter Philippi Luellen
one negro woman named Fanny and
her increase, which negroes are now in the
possession of my said Daughter Philippi
Luellen also the sum of thirty five and
fifty five pounds to be paid by Executors to the
said James S Bates for the use & benefit
my said Daughter Philippi Luellen during
her life at her death the negroes and money
be equally divided between her Daughter
Item I Give and bequeath to my
Grand Daughter Mariah Luellen
