

Know all men by these presents that I Terence McKune being sound
in mind and not having any derangement in my mental faculties
but in possession of my proper senses do make the following disposition
and arrangement of all my worldly property viz. My real and
personal goods and chattels which I am now in possession of.

And I do furthermore acknowledge this to be my last will and
testament and wish it to be transmitted to posterity as such.
I do hereby make the following disposition and distribution of all
the property I am now possessed of, I do bequeath and give unto
my wife Mary McKune all my real, personal and household furni-
ture, my goods, chattels &c. together with all cash on hand, all
notes, accounts and bills due me for her the said Mary's behoof,
benefit and special use to be hers to have and to hold for ever
in preference to all heirs or claimants, except the sum of one
hundred and fifty dollars which I bequeath and give to Terence
McLisshet now a resident of the County Fermanagh Ireland.
It is to be understood that it is my will and positive intention
that the aforesaid \$150. be made and collected of, in and out of
the goods and chattels bequeathed to my wife Mary aforesaid.

And it is my wish that the said \$150. be sent to Ireland as
soon as collected to pay said McLisshet's passage to America.
I bequeath and give unto Hugh Quinn One hundred and thirty dol-
lars to be collected out of the aforesaid goods and chattels bequeathed
to Mary my wife which by an Inventory taken by Jas Eife
and Edw^d Heneghes amts to one thousand dollars.

I bequeath and give to John McKune a small bay horse now in Mr Hughes' stable. I do now hereby testify that all the bequests and dispositions of my property as above stated is according to my will and desire and that it is my last wish, will and testament.
