

In the name of God Amen, I Thomas Ellingsworth of the County of Jefferson and State of Kentucky do make and publish this instrument of writing to be my last will and testament and do hereby revoke all others heretofore by me made.

It is my wish that my body be decently buried by my Executors hereafter named, my soul I resign to its Almighty creator in full hopes of eternal happiness through the merits of my blessed Redeemer. And as it respects my worldly estate I leave as follows to wit:

- 1<sup>st</sup> I direct that all my just debts be paid and funeral expenses.
- 2<sup>nd</sup> To my wife Amelia I leave her the plantation on which I live containing by survey thirty nine and  $\frac{1}{4}$  acres, together with all the household and kitchen furniture, stock of every description &c, with the exception of what may be necessary sold to pay my just debts and funeral expenses, to have and to hold the same during her widowhood; but in case she (Amelia Ellingsworth my wife) should marry again she shall only have her lawful share of this my estate.
- 3<sup>rd</sup> To my son Bartholomew Ellingsworth I give one dollar current money to be paid to him after the marriage or death of my wife.
- 4<sup>th</sup> To my daughter Elizabeth Thorn I give her one dollar to be paid after the marriage or death of my wife.
- 5<sup>th</sup> To my son William Ellingsworth I give him one dollar to be paid after the marriage or death of my wife.
- 6<sup>th</sup> To my son Charles Ellingsworth I give him one dollar to be paid after the marriage or death of my wife.
- 7<sup>th</sup> I desire that at the death or marriage of my wife that all my

after the marriage or death of my wife that all my personal estate shall be sold and the before named children be paid each their respective amount of one dollar out of the money arising from said sale and that the balance of money arising from said sale shall be equally divided between my four children viz. Ann Stubbs, Charlotte Ellingsworth, Katharine Ellingsworth and Lucy Ellingsworth. 8th I desire that at the death or marriage of my wife that the proceeds of my farm shall be equally divided between my son Littleton Ellingsworth and my daughter Lucy Ellingsworth to keep as my daughter Lucy remains single until her death and after her death or marriage the farm to be fully possessed by my son Littleton Ellingsworth and his heirs forever.

And lastly I appoint my friend and neighbor Thomas Waller to be my Executor of this my last will and testament in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this 6<sup>th</sup> day of July One thousand eight hundred and thirty three
