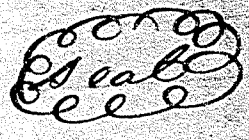

And at the death of my said dear wife, the whole of the estate remaining both real and personal be sold by my Executors hereinafter named and the money thereby arising equally divided amongst my Children
Alms— It is also my will and desire that if my dear wife should marry that the estate may be disposed of as above directed, by my Executors, leaving to her her lawful right of dower.
And furthermore I do hereby constitute, ordain and appoint my true and trusty friends William Querson and W^m Edwards Executors of this my last will and testament, and hereby revoking and making null and void all other wills or wills by me in anywise made, Alone declaring this to be my last will and testament.
In testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this 30th of October 1811

of Kentucky at the Court House in Louisville on the Eighth
day of June 1818. The foregoing instrument of writing purporting
to be the last will and testament of Thomas Grigg dec^d was pro-

William Grigg junior two of the subscribing witnesses thereto
to be the last will and testament of the said Thomas Grigg dec^d
and the same was by said Court ordered to be recorded, which
is done accordingly.
