

In the name of God Amen

I am in the Commemoration of God's Mercy the 23^d day of August 1828 of sound mind and disposing memory, I thoughtfully in body, calling to mind the certainty that I am mortal and wishing previous to my death to make arrangements as to my worldly goods different from those made by Law in case of intestacy do make and publish this instrument as and for my last will and testament

1st I wish and direct that as soon as practicable after my decease the expenses attending my burial as well as all my just debts be paid and satisfied, after which that my outstanding debts and all my liabilities of every kind be collected together

2^d It is my will that my 1/2^d Quidd tract of land of One hundred and eight acres be left to my son Wesley together with my man Moses after the death of my wife

3^d This place I live on I leave to my son John and a negro boy named Lewis and

4th I bequeath Milly and her two children to my daughter Amy

5th I leave to my daughter Mary Lucy and her two children Sam and George

6th All my stock and furniture to be equally divided amongst my children

7th Nothing to be disposed of during the life time of my wife

8th I appoint my wife as executrix and she may choose whom she please to assist her as executrix of this my last will and testament
