then and in that case I wish what is wanting to
make up the above mentioned one thousand dollars
to be made out of my moveable property to her
and her heirs forever to be paid to her at the age of
Eighteen years. Item I devise and bequeath all the
rest and residue of my estate both real and personal
to my wife Sarah to be hers during her life and at
death I devise and bequeath the same to my daughter
Harriett to her and her heirs forever. Lastly I do hereby
constitute my wife Sarah and Samuel Watson
my executors of this my last will and Testament in
witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed
my seal this twentieth day of May in the year of our
Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty

testator to be his last will and

intend and constitute my wife Sarah and Samuel Watson
my executors of this my last will and Testament -
