I William Dougherty of the town of Louisville in the County of Jefferson and State of Kentucky being sick and weak in body but of sound disposing mind and memory do make and publish this my last will and testament in manner and form following to wit,

Imprimis. I devise and will to my beloved wife Elizabeth, my negro man slave Peter and my house and part of lot in Louisville also which I purchased of Abraham Kettinger, in trust that she shall sell the same for the payment of my just debts and I do hereby direct her to sell the same slave and lot with the appurtenances with as little delay as possible and pay the said debts out - the proceeds of said sale or sales and make the necessary Bill of sale and deed or deeds of conveyance to the purchaser or purchasers

Item. I give and bequeath to my said wife and her heirs and assigns forever my negro boy Charles and negro woman Belphear and the remainder of my property of every kind in possession or in expectancy (gray mare excepted) I give to my said wife in trust for her

kept together for the maintenance of herself and my children
she having by these presents full power to make sale of any part
thereof at her will and pleasure or to give any part thereof to my
children she may choose —

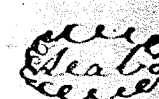
I give and bequeath my gray mare to my daughter Patsy to her
and her heirs forever —

Item. It is my will and desire that my said wife shall continue
my son William at school and give him the best education in her
power. It is also my will and desire that my said wife shall be
governed by the Counsel and advice of my friends Alexander Pope
Levi Syler and Warden Pope or any two of them as to the time and
manner of selling said house and lot and negro Peter and
every other matter concerning my children and the management of
her affairs —

Item. I appoint my said wife Guardian to all my children until
they arrive at lawful age or marry and it is my wish I hereby
direct that no security shall be demanded of my said wife as
Executrix of this my last will and Testament by any Court
whatsoever. And lastly I hereby appoint and constitute my said
wife Executrix of this my last will and Testament and revoke
all other wills by me heretofore made.
