 make and declare this as my last will and testament, hereby
 revoking all other wills that I may have heretofore made. I give to
 son John all my lands in the Co County of Shelby or the price of
 should the be sold before my death. I also give to my said son
 my negro man Dick, but the said negro man Dick is to... em
 stated at the age of forty five years. I also give to my said son
 John a tract of land on the head waters of Boagras adjoining
 Sink, Pomeroy and others, he having paid to Joseph H. Pendlay for
 the said land to which I was to have conveyed it.

I give and bequeath to my son William a tract of land for 32
acres, lying on the South of the land on which I lived in the
Settlement. I also give to my said son William a negro man
named Coshua and an old negro man named Ben.

Having given to my daughters Penelope, Jane, Elizabeth and Mary
a full share of my estate, It is my will that they shall have no
of the residue.

I give and bequeath to my Sons Alexander and Nathaniel the use
of my estate to be equally divided between them by my Executors.

I give and bequeath to my wife Penelope during life my negro man Joshua, my negro man Wick and a negro woman or girl named Maria belonging to Abner Field which I am entitled to during the life of myself and my said wife and two hundred dollars payable to be paid by my son William according to a bond given by him for that purpose if she requires it.

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by him for that purpose if she requires it!

My son Alexander has had of me or since me about four hundred
dollars and my son Nathaniel is in the first place to receive four
hundred dollars before the division is made between them and
less I should in my life time collect or receive the amount for
my son Alexander.

My son William now gives me four hundred dollars, to be paid
to me in such sums and at such times as I may require him, but
should I not receive it, I leave the same to my son Nathaniel
equal the sum had of me or due me by my son Alexander, this
will make them equal and then my estate devised to them to be
equally divided between them.

The debt due me by May Abner Field my son in law, I desire
may never be collected of him, unless my Executors may think
necessary to pay some demands against my estate.
