And as touching such worldly estate wherewith it hath pleased god to bless me in this life I give demise and dispose of the same in the following manner my son John and Couard Hochenemith have received of my estate seventy six acres of land at five dollar per acre --- \$380.00. Again my son John Hochenemith receives a brown mare \$25.00

\$30.00. Again Couard Hochenemith receives a horse & saddle & bridle \$10.00. Again Couard Hochenemith receives a horse \$20.00 & saddle & bridle \$24.00 the said John and Couard Hochenemith to pay lawful interest from the year 1801 until such settlements are made by my heirs. And my son-in-law James Brackenridge receives of my estate the sum of \$100.00 And the same James Brackenridge to pay lawful interest from the year 1801. And as untill such times as the settlements are made and done by my heirs if there is not enough after my debts are paid of my estate to divide among the younger children the said John and Couard Hochenemith and my son-in-law James Brackenridge is to pay back to the rest of the children until they all have an equal share unto my heirs Davis Hochenemith and Eve Hochenemith. I do hereby disallow revoke and disannul all and every other former testament will bequest and executors by me in anywise before named written and bequeathed ratifying and confirming this and no other to be

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In the name of God amen I Alexander Manning of the county of Jefferson & State of Kentucky being weak in body but sound in mind and memory & knowing it is appointed unto men once to die do make and ordain this my last will & testament in form following first I commit my soul unto the hands of the living and true God & my body to the dust to be buried in a decent and christianlike manner as my Executors to be hereafter named may direct. And after all my just debts are paid.

I Give and bequeath unto my son William Murraim the tract of land which I now possess with all the appurtenances thereto belonging to him and his heirs forever by his paying after he comes of age fifty dollars to each of his sisters beginning at the eldest & so on to the youngest yearly untill he pays the amount of two hundred & fifty dollars but if he refuses to take the land on these terms I will it be sold to the highest bidder & the money equally divided among all my children but if the land should be lost my will is that my son William should have an equal share of my other property with his sisters I further will that my daughters should continue to live on the untill my son William comes of age & each derive the same advantage from the rent of that part of the place which they may judge best to rent out excepting so much as will be sufficient to pay for the schooling of my son William till he gets a good Common English Education in addition to my other property hereafter to be named I will that my son William shall have one of the best horses that may be raised from the brood mares that will be left for the use of the family when he comes of age provided he continues to live with his sisters like them If not he is not to have the horse nor no part of his value I will the two bay mares that now work for the use of the family at large with cows & four ewes all the killing hogs for the present & ensuing year & one breeding sow the crop of corn hemp and flax one plough two horses one ass & two mules one smoothing Iron each of my daughters is to keep their own

saddles and procure among themselves one for those who have not got any, likewise I leave for the use of the family two pots two ovens & one kettle I will and bequeath unto John Starr one mare Colt Saddle Pan & the Bridle & saddle Called Williams one mare Colt I give to each of my daughters one bed & furniture and as there is one bed lacking I will they should make it up among themselves I give unto my son William the bed and furniture that I generally lie on also my bridle & saddle I will that all the rest of my property should be sold by my executor & all the horse least not before named, the stock of Cattle Hogs & Sheep the household & kitchen furniture the crop of wheat & farming utensils the amount of which I will be equally divided among all my children (To wit) Martha Murraim, Polly Murraim, Judith Murraim Elizabeth Murraim, Katharine Murraim & William Murraim I nominate & appoint my friends William Lewis Thos Lewis & James Lewis executors of this my last Will & Testament & do revoke every other will or Testament ever made by me & declare this to be my only true last will & Testament in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 29th day of September 1808.
