

In the name of God amen. I Agulla Gilbert of Jefferson County and State of Kentucky, being palsy in body but of perfect soundness of mind and memory do constitute this to be my last Will and Testament viz. I give and bequeath to my son Isaac Gilbert all the unsold land of a certain Tract which I have a claim to on Mudlap Creek Madison County also a little negro boy named Elijah, also a little negro Girl named Tanny, to him and the Heirs of his Body lawfully begotten forever.

Item. I give and bequeath to Charles Gilbert a negro Woman named Rachel, with her youngest child named Tom, to him and the Heirs of his body lawfully begotten forever. Item I give and bequeath to my Son Michael Gilbert two young negroes viz. a boy named Andrew, and a girl named Suekey to him, and to the Heirs of his body lawfully forever.

Item. I give and bequeath unto my son Benjamin Gilbert. The Tract of Land whereon I now live containing two Hundred acres be the same more or less, together with ~~two~~ negroes, viz. a negro man named Nathan, and a negro girl named Ball, to him and to the Heirs of his body lawfully begotten forever. Item. I give and bequeath unto my son Samuel Gilbert. negro boy named Nathan, to him and his Heirs forever. Item. I give and bequeath to my Daughter Elizabeth, a little negro girl named Rizziah, also also youngest child named Ete, to her and to the Heirs of her body lawfully begotten forever.

Item. I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Martha; a negro man named James, and a negro boy named Allen to her and to the Heirs of her Body lawfully begotten forever.

Item my will and desire is that my blacksmith tools shall be kept on the premises, and be equally free for all the above mentioned children to do or have their smiths work done by and with them. Item My will and desire is that after my death, that my Executor or Executors, shall nominate three proper disinterested house keepers, who shall have power to divide; all my household and kitchen furniture, together with all my stock of every kind, and likewise my plantation and farming utensils into seven equal divisions and then the above mentioned children to chose as they are mentioned in my will, beginning at the eldest an so down to the youngest, and whereas there remains two little negroes not yet disposed of viz. Harry and David. It is my will and desire that they be disposed of after the same manner; my stock tools &c above mentioned are.

Item. My will and desire is that she, have the liberty of living among her children; and that where and when she pleases. Item. Whereas I have a deed for three hundred and some odd acres of land in Madison County (whereon Arthur Kinnedy now lives, it

is my will and desire, that my Daughter Martha have one hundred acres of the same and the residue I give to my son Micha Gilbert to him and then heirs forever. Thus. I do hereby revoke all other will or Wills made by me and constitute this my last will and testament, and appoint Micha Gilbert Benjamin Nicholson & Benjamin Gilbert my Sole Executors to this my last will and testament Given under my hand and Seal this twenty ninth day of December one thousand eight hundred & six

 be to return to the use of my Family. The Balan-
 ce of my Estate both real and personal I lend to
 my wife during her life or widowhood, and
 after her decease the land on which I live I
 bequeath to my son Joseph Bourne, the balance
 of my estate both real and personal I bequeath
 unto my five Daughters to be divided in equal
 shares. — Lastly I constitute and appoint Samuel
 Rice and Elijah Bourne the executors of this my
 last will and Testament; Revoking all others
 will or Wills heretofore by me made I do set my
 hand and affix my seal to this, the thirty first
 day of march In the year of our Lord 1807
