I Charles Ellet of Jefferson County and State of Kentucky Being now the 5th year of my age and in good health and in my right mind knowing the uncertainty of life and the certainty of death do think fit to make and ordain and with my own hand ~~write~~ ^{write} and this my last Will and testament in manner and form following first I cheerfully ~~renew~~ ^{renew} my soul to God who gave and my body to be buried at the discretion of my surviving friends I am as to my worldly goods I dispose of them as follows. And first all my lawfull debts paid I have given my Daughter Philadelphia Summar two negroes Mary a seven years old and Berrill four years a Ward saddle and bridle a cow calf and feather bed and furniture. I have given my Daughter Janny Burd two negroes Mully a seven years old and Sarah a six years old a horse saddle and bridle a cow and calf a feather bed and furniture I have given my Daughter Patey Pruit two negroes Nanny seven years old and Betty four years old a horse saddle and bridle a cow and calf a bed and furniture I have given my son Richard two negroes Berrill seven years old and Rachel seven years old

423 a horse saddle and bridle a cow calf and feather bed and furniture the I allance of my estate I have not given away I leave to my beloved wife Susanna Ellet to dispose of following when my younger sons John Galt and Thomas Ellet and Charin Ellet a man to the age of 21 years old that they shall have each of them a horse saddle and bridle a cow calf and feather bed and furniture out of my estate and when they are at the age of 21 years old they shall have each ~~two~~ ^{two} negroes each to be between ten and six years old or their value. If my beloved wife should not live until my youngest son is twenty one years old I order that my estate of negroes only and their ~~surviving~~ ^{surviving} money be left in the hands of my executors of a live or man appointed by the court of Jefferson County until he is twenty one years old at which time he shall receive his two negroes horse saddle and bridle a cow and calf a feather bed and furniture. At the death of my beloved wife if before my youngest son Charles is 21 years old all my property except land and negroes shall be sold and the money arising from such sale be equally divided to all my children Philadelphia Richard Jane Patey John Galt Mr. Ellet and Charles that

 that is given a way her life time and at her
 death if after my youngest son Charles is 21
 years old it is my will that my sons ^{that} ~~that~~
 then living shall divide my land among them
 or sell it and divide the money which they
 please and the best of my estate of all
 kinds to be sold and the money arising from
 such sale to be equally divided to all my
 children namely ~~Richard~~ ^{Richard}

 Charles ~~that~~ if any of my sons should
 not live to the age of twenty one years old
 it is my will that the rest of my sons
 shall enjoy my land and the ~~divided~~

~~my sons and daughters or their living heirs~~
 intended before signed on the sixth line
 the words all my lawfull debts paid
 Lastly I appoint my beloved Wife Susanna

On the 14th day of April 1813
 in the last sickness of David Hoover, Senior
 of this County I was called upon by said Hoover
 to write his will which I wrote as follows
 Elizabeth Hoover was to have her third part
 her share more Hoover of Spangine County
 have all his land and other property except his
 wife's part: he also wanted that his Brother
 Henry Hoover should pay some money to a son of
 Andrew Hoover and a son of Thomas
 Goforth who was afflicted should have
 some of his money which was to be paid
 to them by his Brother more Hoover
 did not mention the amount they were to
 have, before I presented it to him in about
 seven hours after he made the Request he
 died: he desired that his wife Elizabeth
 Hoover Andrew Hoover & Henry Hoover Junior
 should be his Executors

third day of November one thousand eight hundred
and twelve, I David of Jefferson County
and State of Kentucky, Being at present
Weak in Body but Sound in mind and Memory
Thanks be to almighty god for it therefore calling
to mind the Mortality of my Body, and knowing
it is appointed for all men once to die, Do make
and ordain this my last will and Testament that is
to say principally and first of all I give and
recommend my soul into the hands of almighty
god that give it and my Body I Recommend
To the earth so that at the general Resurrection
I may Receive the same again by the mighty
power of god, and as Touching such worldly
estate Wherewith I Am Possessed I Give

427. to Bless me with in this life, I give devise
and dispose of the same in the following man-
ner and for no First I Desire that all my
Just Dells and contracts, be settled -
I give and Bequeath to my Beloved Wife
Mary Steel her room Dress Bed and other
furniture Belonging thereto, & Likewise
her thirds of all the cleared land and stock
~~that~~ give to her & Negro Woman Vines
Roke all Business then & future life, the
Negro woman is at her disposal at her death I give
and bequeath to my ^{Wid} son Thomas Steel that
tract of land he now lives ~~on~~ surveyed to him
his heirs and assigns for ever Likewise Bequeath
to my - Beloved Daughter Nancy Sammons and
her heirs one Bed and furniture at her mothers
death - I Likewise Bequeath to my Beloved
Daughter Sally Scantland that tract of land
whereon she now lives as surveyed to her and her
heirs or assigns for ever by paying up the 5th
contract to her fathers Estate which is contained
William Scantland and her father, I Likewise
Bequeath to my Beloved Sons ^{David} David & Samuel
together all my land and negroes and all the
appurtenances thereto, Both Real and personal,
to Bequally Divided, ^{according} to Quality, and I will
that - and I do Trust wholly at all our
Revocable & annul all and every other form
or Testaments wills and bequeaths by me in
any wise before & after Made and Bequeath
Relinquishing and assigning unto them and
their heirs my Last will and Testament
