tors hereafter to be named out of the profits
of that part of my estate left my wife, on
the sale of such part of my stock or paid
out of debts due me as my executors shall
think of most advantage to the estate. The
rest of the estate given to my wife to be by her
disposed of at her death to any of my children
or grand children as she may think proper

I do nominate constitute and appoint Joseph
Crockett Elijah Cartwright and John Barkly Executors
of this my last will and Testament hereby revoking &
declaring void all former wills by me in anywise
made declaring this and no other my Last will

Sally Gates, One young negroe, One feather
Bed, One Horse and saddle to be worth
Eighty Dollars to her and her heirs forever
Item I give unto my beloved Daughter Sophia
Gates One young negroe, and feather Bed,
One Horse and saddle to be worth 80 Dollars
to her and her heirs forever.

Item I give unto my beloved ~~Daughter~~ ^{son} ~~Sophia~~

Daughter Lucinda Gates One young negroe
One feather Bed, one Horse and saddle to
be worth Eighty Dollars to her and her heirs
forever. Item It is my desire that my
Executors raise or purchase out of the pro-
ceeds of the sales of the lands as above
directed the three young negrees given to
my three daughters as above: as soon as
they shall marry or arrive at the age of
fifteen years old each.

Item I give unto James Gates son of Elijah
Gates my share in the Lexington Library
to him and his heirs forever.

Item I give unto my beloved wife Lavinia
Gates the whole of the residue of my estate
consisting of the plantation I now live on
and one negroe woman named Darcus, stock
of every kind and property of every species
not herein before disposed of One half of
which I have unto her during her natu-
ral life, the other half I give and beque-
ath unto her and her heirs forever, after
her death the last half as aforesaid
I desire may be equally divided among
my

Daughters above mentioned It is further
my desire that my beloved wife Summa
Gates raise and educate my said children
until they arrive at an age sufficient
to choose their own Guardians -

I do hereby appoint my beloved wife Summa
Gates Executor and my beloved Brother
Elyah Gates and my friend Henry Chiles
Executors to this my will and Testament
In Testimony whereof I have hereunto
