In the name of God Amen I Cornelius Emerson of the County of Jefferson and State of Kentucky being weak in body but sound in mind and memory and knowing it is appointed unto men once to die do make and ordain this my last will and Testament in form following and first I commit my body to the dust to be buried in a decent and Christian like manner as my Executors to be hereafter named may direct and my soul into the hands of the living God and after all my just debts are paid I will and bequeath to my loving wife Hannah Emerson the following property during her widowhood viz the lot of

land on which I now live with all the appurtenances thereunto. Belonging with all the corn on the place claimed by me all the present stock of Bacon and sugar on hand the whole of the place on the place also her choice of one horse beast & two milk cows all my stock of hogs and sheep two good beds bedsteads and a set of curtains with all the bed furniture that may be on hand after my three youngest children are provided for as will be named hereafter also a chest and all the trunks belonging to me all the open barrels for house hold use all the chains the cupboard and all the furniture belonging to it, the loom and all the bucklings belonging to it, one large Bible and looking glass all the table linen, after furnishing each of the girls with two table clothes a piece, one large and one small wheel, one reel, and one folding table her choice of two pots, one lake Kettle & one large Kettle, two Buckets and a tea Kettle. But if she should marry my will is that the above named property should be appraised by three disinterested men and sold by my Executors, or equally divided among all my children to be hereafter named except value of one hundred dollars of said property which I with my wife Hannah Empson shall keep during life and dispose of at her death as she sees fit. I also give and bequeath to my son John the lot of land on which he now lives and his heirs with all the appurtenances thereunto belonging at the value of two hundred and forty dollars provided that amount should be found a greater proportion than each of my other children gets of my property I will that my son John shall pay up the surplus so as to make each of the other children equal in the property I give with himself. I give to my to my

Daughter Elizabeth one feather bed and bedstead one boulder two pillars two sheets two good coverlets and two good Blankets, I give to my son Cornelius the same kind of bed and furniture. I also give to my Daughter Rachel the same kind of bed and furniture, and I will they should be retained in the hands of my wife until they marry or come of age. I also will that my son Cornelius and Daughter Rachel, receive such a share of English Education as my Executors may think proper and the expense thereof paid by them out of my estate. I also will that the Balance of my Estate, not heretofore named be it real or personal, be sold at the discretion of my Executors & equally divided among all my children (To-wit) Richard Empson John Empson Thomas Empson, Sarah Stephens Polly McDonald, Margaret Bryan, Elizabeth Empson Cornelius Empson & Rachel Empson. So that each may have an equal part of what I possess including the property heretofore given by will or otherwise for my will is that all my children above named should share alike to the amount of a Cent. I do constitute and appoint my beloved Wife Hannah Empson Executors in conjunction with my friend Nathaniel Harris as Executors of this my last will and testament, and by these presents do revoke all other wills ever made by me and declare this to be my last will and testament in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 37 day of May one thousand eight hundred and eight signed sealed and acknowledged in presence of

In addition to the above property bequeathed to my wife Hannah Impson I further will and bequeath unto my said wife Hannah the following property during her widowhood (viz) one bridle and side saddle two iron pot racks three pair of pot hooks one small square table one large ladle and flesh fork one iron fire shovel one good ax and one hoe all the dried peaches on hand two good sack bags & one straw basket all the fowls all the earthen pots and crocks, one small pen of steel yards one barrel of vinegar all the troughs and what is contained in them one lantern & one umbrella all the molasses on hand 1 milk churn one glass huckle one griddle one cedar keel with iron hoops, one meat sifter and the flat Iron all the big wheel spools one pair of wool cards the handle molds all the raw and spun wool and all the spun thread ball the bowls & popper all the Cotton duetins and ballies which was procured to make bed quilts two books the saints rest & discipline I do declare this to be a true list of all annexed to my will and revoke all others ever made by me. In the Name of God Amen I Samuel Sodusky do make and ordain this my last will and Testament in the manner and form following First I do hereby direct and empower my Executor hereinafter mentioned to sell the land whereon I now live and also my stock of every description house hold and kitchen furniture for the best price that can be had and on such terms as my Executor hereafter mentioned shall deem best except that my two Daughters Katurah and Elizabeth shall have it in their power to keep the two horses and their Saddles at their valuation which horses they claim as theirs and also Jacob Sodusky my son is to have my third horse. And the money arising from the sale of my said estate except as before excepted I hereby give to my three Daughters and Grand daughter (viz) Hannah Elizabeth Sally and grand daughter Betsy Severston an equal division of the money & all other money that I may inherit except the two sum of fifteen pounds each which by agreement with my sons Andrew Anthony John & Jacob where to be given by my 2^d sons to their sisters, which two sum of fifteen pounds being unpaid by John Anthony amounting to thirty pounds is to be divided between my three daughters Andrew Sodusky having paid to his sister Betsy Severston mother to my 2^d Grand daughter the sum due from him & I do hereby direct that my son Jacob shall be exonerated from the payment of the fifteen pounds
