In the name of God Amen I Daniel Huber of the county
of Jefamind and state of Kentucky being weak in body
but in sound mind and memory as I ever was, thanks
be to God Almighty for the same, and not knowing the
uncertainty of this transitory life and that death it must
come upon all men, and not knowing how sudden my
own way to do make and ordain this my last will
and testament as follows. First I recommend my soul
to Almighty God most humbly from whom I receive it,
fully trusting through the merits of my blessed redemption
son Christ to receive pardon and remission for all my
sins and enjoy eternal felicity. My body I commit
to the earth from whence I received it, therein to be
buried in a Christian like manner at the discretion
of my Executors and as touching my worldly estate
after my funeral charges and just debts are paid
and discharged I dispose of the same as follows viz
Item I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife

Dinah Huber all that tract or parcel of land which I purchased
of Walter Kinn on Shelys branch and Hickmans Creeks one house
called Orup one mare called Junny and her last Colt called
muelburg and her choice of two cows and calves and my Plan-
tation Tools and utensils together with my Horse feed and
Kitchen furniture my will and desire is that after the death
of my wife Dinah Huber that every thing that I have here-
in given and bequeathed her shall be sold and an equal distri-
bution made amongst my five children, namely Bidamira
Huber, Allanson Huber, George Huber, Julianus Huber and Jane
Huber also my the balance of my stock of Cattle, Hogs, and Sheep
in said manner above.

Item I give and bequeath to my Daughter Bidamira Huber a sorrel
mare called and known by name of Orange which she has
now in her possession to her and her heirs for ever.

Item I give and bequeath to my son Allanson Huber a Colt that
he got of ~~Wm~~ Campbells, also my Saddle and Bridle to him
and his heirs for ever.

Item I give to my son George Huber the first Colt that the mare Jenny
brings after the date of this will to him and his heirs for ever.

Item It is my will and desire that my two girls Julianus and Jane be
made equal in proportion to Bidamira out of the
residue of my estate in my wifes hands whenever
they come to age and want the same. There is a
Horse yet unmentioned called Merry Tomb my wife
and desire is that he may remain on the Plantation
for the benefit thereof or sold for the use thereof.

Item The balance of the four hundred acres of land bought
of William Ford on the head of Little Twin after Sutton
gets out his one hundred acres he sells and Stafford paid
up his balance by my Executors, then it is my wish

two sons Mansow Hubo and George Hubo.
Item It is also my desire that blind Daughter Abby Hubo
may have her maintenance amongst my other
children lastly I do nominate and Appoint my said
wife Dinah Hubo, Executors and Walter Kend Executors of
this my last will and testament hereby revoking
all others by me made In witness whereof I have
unto set my hand and seal this Eleventh day of Sep-
tember one thousand eight hundred and four.
