his heirs and assigns for ever Likewise Bequeath
to my Beloved Daughter Nancy Lamm and
her heirs one Acre and punture at her mothers
death - I likewise Bequeath to my Beloved
Daughter Sally Seantland that tract of land
whereon she now lives as surveyed to her and her
heirs or assigns for ever by paying up the 5th
contract to her fathers Estate when it is due
William Seantland and her father, I likewise
Bequeath to my Beloved Son David & Samuel
all my land and negroes and all the
appurtenances thereto, Both Real and Personal,
to be equally Divided, ^{amongst} Equally and I will
and I do Trust wholly at all our
Revocable & cannot all and every other form
in Testaments wills and bequeaths by me in
any wise before Howard Miller and Bequeath

I have already given my daughter Sally Sutton all I intend to give her and also have give my daughter Vally Smith all I intend to give her I have also give unto my daughter Betty Alfred all I intend to give her I also have already give my son Abram two negroes named Sam and Jane I have also give my son William two negroes named March and Bet it is my desire that Abram have as much of my personal property as shall make his Negro girls it is my will and desire that Equal in value with William's Negro girls it is my will and desire that all the Rest of my estate be Equally divided Between my two before mentioned It also is my will and desire that my sons Abram and William Fulkerson be my Executors in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 6th day of April 1812
