I David Taylor of the County of Jefferson and State of Kentucky being sick and weak in body but perfect and sound in ^{mind} memory and calling to mind that it is appointed for all men once to die I do therefore make and ordain this my last will and Testament and first of all I give my soul to the almighty God who gave it to me. Hoping to receive the same again at the General Resurrection through the mighty power of Christ my glorious Redeemer and my Body I recommend to the earth to be buried in a decent and Christian

like manner at the discretion of my Executor - whom I shall ^{hereafter} nominate and appoint - and touching such worldly substance or estate wherewith it hath pleased God to bless me in this life I give and bequeath the same in manner and form following (Viz) I allow all the Lawful debts that are against me to be paid out of my moveable property or estate as also the necessary expenses of my funeral - the residue of my estate both real and ^{all} personal I will and bequeath unto my Brother John Taylor under the proviso or restriction that he shall keep the family that is to say my young Brother Joseph and unmarried sisters Together and raise them up, and in case any of the two eldest of them sisters may change their state by getting married in that case he is to do a generous part by them and likewise by the two younger ones and Brother Joseph when they come to that ^{age} maturity that they may change their state he is likewise to do a generous part by each of them also - and lastly I nominate constitute ordain and appoint my trusty and well beloved Brother Andrew

I John Donnelly to be the sole Executor of this my Last Will and Testament and I hereby do empower him to see that every clause part or restriction mentioned in this will be fully put into execution and Complied with - and furthermore I hereby renounce revoke and disannull all former wills by me heretofore made - Ratifying and Confirming this and this only to be my real and true Last will and Testament In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this 31st day of December ~~1801~~ in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and ~~one~~
