And as touching such worldly estate wherewith it hath pleased god to bless me in this life I give demise and dispose of the same in the following manner my son John and Couard Hochenemith have received of my estate seventy six acres of land at five dollar per acre --- \$380.00. Again my son John Hochenemith receives a brown mare \$25.00

\$30.00. Again Couard Hochenemith receives a horse & saddle & bridle \$10.00. Again Couard Hochenemith receives a horse \$20.00 & saddle & bridle \$24.00 the said John and Couard Hochenemith to pay lawful interest from the year 1801 until such settlements are made by my heirs. And my son in law James Brackenridge receives of my estate the sum of \$100.00 And the same James Brackenridge to pay lawful interest from the year 1801. And as untill such times as the settlements are made and done by my heirs if there is not enough after my debts are paid of my estate to divide among the younger children the said John and Couard Hochenemith and my son in law James Brackenridge is to pay back to the rest of the children until they all have an equal share unto my heirs Davis Hochenemith and Eve Hochenemith. I do hereby disallow revoke and disannul all and every other former testament will bequest and executors by me in anywise before named written and bequeathed ratifying and confirming this and no other to be
