 the Land I willed above I give and it is hereby ord-
 ered to be equally divided amongst all my Children and
 their heirs. As to my Stock of Horses it is my Will
 that they be divided amongst all my Children.
 As to my Stock of Sheep and Hogs it is my Will
 that they all remain on the Plantation at the
 Disposal of my son John for the support of him
 and his sister Gennet and Susanah Gilmore
 and the other Part of their families.

In the name of God amen I Elizabeth Gilmore being weak in Body but in Perfect mind and memory do make and ordain this my last Will and Testament as follows. First of all give my soul to God who give it and as Touching such Worldly goods as it has Pleas'd God to Bless me with I dispose in the following manner. As to my part of the land which fell to me by the death of my son Samuel Gilmore which is a part of the tract of land now live on, I give and bequeath to my son John Gilmore his heirs and assigns forever. Also I give and bequeath to my said son John all the farming utensils which is on said land and belongs to me, and also my Wagon and Gear I also give and bequeath to my said son John my Negro Manch Sabeth, which I bought of Capt. Patrick Gray to him my said son John his heirs and assigns forever. I also give to my said son John my corner Cupboard and Dining Table. I then I give and bequeath to my son John my Daughter Genet Gilmore and my Daughter Susanah Gilmore to be equally divided amongst them all my Beds and furniture belonging to the said Beds. But if the value of said Beds and furniture should be more than the value of the Beds and furniture when equally divided as above to my three Children last above named then the Value of the Beds and furniture which my four Daughter which are married

have each of them got when it shall be valued, then and in that case I ordain and it is my Will that such surplus if any shall be equally divided amongst all my Children or the heirs of their bodies. I then I give and bequeath to my two Daughters Genet and Susanah Gilmore all my Table furniture such as Dishes Plates Bowls Glasses &c. to be equally divided between them. I then I give and bequeath to my son John and my Daughters Genet and Susanah all my Kitchen furniture (to wit) Pots & tiles &c. to be equally divided between them. As to my stock of Cows &c. it is my Will that my two Daughters Eloner M'Campbell and Elizabeth Simpson have each a good Cow and heffer and the residue of my Cows &c. to be equally divided amongst my son John and my two Daughters Genet and Susanah. I then I give and bequeath to my Daughter Eloner M'Campbell my little yellow negro girl Janney to her and the heirs of her body forever. As to my Negro wench Rachel and her children that she now has (Capt. Janney above named) and that she may have at my death I allow to be Equally divided amongst my Children hereafter named (to wit) Martha Burton, Sarah M'Campbell, Elizabeth Simpson, Genet Gilmore and Susanah Gilmore. It is my Will and it is hereby ordered that all my Just debts and funeral Charges be paid out of what

94. money is due me by Bonds notes or otherwise in this State or in the State of Virginia as I have one half of the money due from Hugh Browford in Virginia having paid two of the Legatees to whom the money Browford owed was Willed their part of it and took the their part of the s^d debt in lue of the money I paid them) and the Balance of said money due me as above order to be equally divided amongst all my Children (to wit) My Daughter Martha Bixten Stoner M^cCampbell Sarah M^cCampbell Elizabeth Simpson Junnet Gilmore Susanah Gilmore and my son John Gilmore Ham. As to my stock of Sheep and Hogs it is my Will that they all remain on the Plantation at the Disposal of my Son John for the support of him and his sisters Junnet and Susanah Gilmore and the other part of their families. Ham. If the Lands on Gilberts Creek be recovered order and it is my Will that all my part of said Land or the value thereof be equally

As to the Land on the North West side of the Ohio which is Military Land Willed to me by my Brother Adam Wallace, It is my Will that it be sold by my Executors and the money arising from such sale to be Equally divided amongst all my Children. And it is ordered and I do hereby empower my Executors hereafter named to make Titles to the persons who may purchase any of the Lands sold under this my Will and to do whatever may be necessary and just to carry this my Will into Effect. and also to make divisions of any part of my Estate hereby Willed amongst the Legatees or appoint proper persons to make such division. And I do hereby nominate and appoint my beloved Brother John Wallace and my beloved son John Gilmore my Executors of this my last will and testament. I do hereby set free from after my death) and such of them as shall not have attained the age of twenty five years (except as before excepted) shall be hired out until they shall be severally of the age aforesaid; the hire of Violet Nancey & Peter I give unto my sister Helen Ball I give the hire of Buford until he is twenty five years old to my brother Andrew & John I give the hire of James until he attains the age of twenty five years to my brother Jacob W. Walker I give the hire of Hartwell to my nephew David Walker I give the hire of Abraham until he attains the age of twenty five years old to my sister Margaret Temple In order that there may be no misunderstanding with respect to the disposal of said negroes and the limitations and conditions above mentioned I here declare my meaning is to that the said negroes David, Buford, James, Violet Nancey, Abraham, Hartwell & Peter shall be fed and their increase when ever the purposes and limitations above stated are fulfilled to wit: First that three my said negroes hire have raised a sum of money sufficient to pay my debts and secondly that they shall severally attain the age of twenty five years old and their hire applied as above directed and further that there may be no mistake
