I Francis Bourne of Jefferson County and State of Kentucky, Being in a declining state of health but in the common use of my mental powers thanks to God—Judge it expedient now to make a will and shew how the little Living Kind Providence has put into my hands may be ordered. When I am gone.—All my Just Debts to be paid First. Tabatha White, my Eldest Daughter deceased, sometime ago I gave her cattle two cows & calves some pork & live hogs with other trifles to her & her heirs forever. Second. William Bourne my Eldest son, to him I gave a good Horse worth thirty pounds one hundred acres of Land & a negro boy called Ben. to him and his heirs forever.

86 Third. Lucy Lowens To her I gave a cow and a bay  
mare and called both to be hers & her heirs forever  
Fourth. Agnes Hudson, To her I gave one hundred  
acres of land & a negro girl called Lucy and a bay  
horse called mack, a cow and to be hers and her  
heirs forever. In consequence of these gifts, it being  
something more than the rest of my children has  
received her husband Joshua Hudson has agreed to  
furnish or provide a horse & saddle for Tabitha  
White my Granddaughter a descendant of the  
Deceased Tabitha White Fifth. Abner Bourne  
my second son, To him I gave sixty six acres  
of land a cow and other trifles to be his and his  
heirs forever Sixth. Ambrose Bourne, to him  
I gave a young negro man called Harry, a bay  
mare, two cows & calves, fifteen pounds cash  
& fifteen barrels of corn But from this is to be  
deducted forty five pounds, few shillings money  
he paid for me, this is to be his & his heirs forever.  
Seventh. Fanny Young, To her I gave a negro woman  
called Maw a feather bed and furniture a cow &  
calf with other trifles, to be hers & her heirs forever  
Eighth. Philadelphia Baislow, To her I gave

87 a negro boy called Aaron a bed & instead of  
furniture, a cow & calf some pork and other tri-  
fles. To be hers and her heirs forever Ninth  
John Bourne To him I gave a young saw horse a  
bed & furniture to be his & his heirs forever  
The land on which I live I give in Equal share  
to my two youngest sons John Bourne & Daniel  
Bourne, exclusively, by this I mean that this  
article is not to be considered. In the final  
settlement - the rest of my personal prop-  
erty I leave in the hands of my wife & two  
youngest sons John & Daniel for their sole  
use & that after the decease of myself & wife  
they call call some discreet person or persons  
who shall divide the personal property then  
in hand of my living between John Bourne  
Daniel Bourne & those of my legacies except  
Tabitha White who may think they have  
not received an equal share. Lastly. I con-  
stitute and appoint John Bourne &  
Daniel Bourne my Executors of this my  
last will & Testament According and making  
void all other will or wills heretofore by me  
made and do sign my Hand and Affix my  
seal This second day June 1813.

It is my Will and it is hereby ordered that all my just debts and funeral charges be paid out of what money is due me by Bonds notes or other ways in this state or in the state of Virginia (as I have on half of the money due from Hugh Brownford in Virginia having paid two of the Legacies to whom the money - Brownford owes was Willed their part of it and took the their part of the d<sup>d</sup> Debt in two of the money I paid them) And the Ballance of said Money become as above I order to be equally divided amongst all my children (to wit) My Daughters Martha Brinton (latter M<sup>c</sup> Campbell Sarah M<sup>c</sup> Campbell, Elizabeth Simpson Gurnet Gilmore, Susanah Gilmore and my son John Gilmore - Nam It is also my Will that all my part of my son Samuel Gilmore's Estate except the Land I willed above I give and it is hereby ordered to be Equally divided amongst all my children and their heirs - As to my stock of Horses it is my Will that they be divided amongst all my children As to my stock of sheep and Hogs it is my Will that they all remain on the Plantation at the disposal of my son John for the support of him and his sister Gurnet and Susanah Gilmore and the other part of their families.
