 the estate it is my desire that my
 executors (after receiving a full
 and ample support for my wife
 Mariah during her life, would
 ascertain the value of the balance
 of the Estate and give to the one
 who my wife with a division his equal
 proportion of the balance so to
 continue to each division in
 relation till the last has his order
 share it is to be understood that
 the reservation made as above
 for my wife Mariah after her death
 shall be equally divided

Amou of the surviving heirs

It is my desire that if any of my children should unfortunately be maimed or other wise be injured by misfortune so as to be a disadvantage to them in obtaining a Livestock that then my executors shall give to the one so disabled such a sum over and above the equal division as to them shall appear right, it is my intention that either of my sons Education should extend farther than a common English education that such expence over and above the price of an English Education should be deducted from his equal proportion of the Estate. I do hereby again appoint and constitute William M. Dowd, John L. Martin and George Maderson Executors and Mariad Maderson Executrix of this my last will and testament, revoking all others and declaring this to be my last will.
