but being perfect in memory and sound mind
bles? be God do make constitute and appoint
this my last will Testament in manner & form
as follows To wit. And first I do resign my
spirit to him who give it and my body to be
buried in a decent and Christian manner
hoping to receive it again at the great
resurrection day

2^{dly} I do give & bequeath unto my son
John Allison fifty acres of land whereon
he now lives to him and his heirs in case
he shall have any issue or lawfull heir
if otherwise then to be equally divided be-
tween my other children and in case my
said son John Allison shall not continue
to live on the said land but shall move

or leave the said land in that case it is my
will to have the said land divided as above
directed 3^{dly} I do give and bequeath unto
my son Thomas Allison the tract of land whereon
I now live with the houses and improvements
thereon in case he shall behave himself well-
morally and as a good citizen ought to do other-
wise then it is my will to give said land to my
daughter Nancy Allison to be her property
I allow my son Thomas to have the small
horse either sell him or keep him & pay all
my ^{just} debts 4^{thly} I do give and bequeath unto
my Daughter Nancy Allison all my moveable
property namely the live stock on my plantation
with the household & kitchen furniture and also
the house I now live in to be hers in possession
while she remains single but if she marries or
shall not choose to live with then to be given
up to my son Thomas Allison on the condition
before mentioned Out of my live stock I reserve
two cows to be given to my grandsons and

To John Weathers the other to Peter Campbell It is also my will that the farming tools go with the plantation Also I give to my said daughter all the money owing to me I fully do give and bequeath unto my two daughters that are married Polly Campbell Peter Weathers five shillings each

And lastly I do make constitute and appoint John Campbell Peter Weathers my sole Executors of this my last will and testament In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 14th day of June in year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred two
