In the name of God amen - I James Johnson do make and ordain this my last will and testament hereby revoking all others heretofore made by me first it is my will and desire that all my just debts and funeral expences be first paid by Executors herein after mentioned I do give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Sarah all my property wheather real or personal during her life at her death it is my will and desire that all my negroes be liberated by my my execs, provided however that should any of my said negroes at the death of my wife be under the age of twenty one years old then and in that case it is my will and desire that my brother Syllas Johnson do take charge of them and when they or either of them arrives at the age of twenty one years old he shall and they one to be liberated giving my said brother power to bring them out to such trades as he may deem most proper for them to learn, but should should any of the said negroes or there increase be females they are to be liberated at the age of ^{eight} ~~seventeen~~ years old with this exception however as to my negroes Daniel and Rubin, that is to say should a debt which I owe to Andrew Muldrow be still due at the death of my wife or any part of it or previous to her death and my wife shall cancel the said negroes Daniel and Rubin are to be hired to raise money sufficient to pay the

said debt provided however my ^{sons} are not to hire the said negroes nor neither of them to the said Andrew Muldrow and should my wife not consent to the hiring the said negroes for the purpose above mentioned then my ^{executors} to raise the money for the payment thereof in such a manner as they may deem most advantage to my said wife

It is my will and I do hereby direct that my ^{executors} herein after mentioned do after the death of my wife dispose of my lands and all other property of every species not herein before disposed of except my books and out of the money arising from the sale pay to my nephew James Johnson one thousand dollars which I give him the said James, one hundred dollars, I give unto my Brother Ly Cap one hundred dollars, to my Brother Robert and one hundred dollars. I direct my ^{executors} to be payed unto James Blythe and Andrew W. Calla to be sent by them to the General assembly of the Presbyterians to be appropriated by the said assembly to the use of missionaries they may send out all other monies remaining after the payments to the seven persons above mentioned. I give to my brother Samuel and John Muldrow some my wife's brothers to be equally divided between them. I give unto Nathaniel Harris six volumes of Guyre paraphrase - I give unto brother Samuel Harveys works in six volumes I give unto my brother Robert Josephus works in six

volumes I give unto my brother Ly Cap newton on the prophets and Davises sermons in the whole five volumes all the rest of my Books I give unto John Muldrow let my wearing apparat, I desire that my brothers divided between them lastly I appoint John Chin Rodgey patent and George Walker my ^{sons} to this my last will and testament in testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 7th December 1808

The Commissioners met agreeable to the order of Court to settle accounts between Caleb McDowell deceased & Samuel McDowell Administrator upon the said Estate but from the appointment confusion of accounts & disagreement of the statement of either & want of evidence to support the statement of either we the Commissioners find it impossible to progress any thing in bringing their accounts to a close but we here give a statement of such things which are not in dispute.

The amount of the estate appraised as appears by appraisement upon the inventory including ^{the negroes} \$3443.49
 Amount of articles retained by the widow of the deceased together with the negroes at the rate estimated by the appraisers \$2929.94
 Amount of sales sold at vendue \$347.27

The Administrator claims upon account of fifty seven pounds fourteen shillings nine pence halpennies &

part of which account as ~~an~~ dispute is supported by no proof.

The administrators had 2 Negroes hired of the estate which we estimate of seventy Dollars each.

The administrator has in hand notes which he obtained by sales of property sold by virtue of a Judgement obtained upon an attachment against the estate Hampshire a freedman of colour deceased in favour of the estate Caleb McDowell Dec'd. The amount may be discharged by the application to the Sheriff

As death is certain lot of all men I Roger Patton do make and ordain this my last will and testament in order and it is my will that all my just debts and funeral charges be paid out of my estate by my Executors To my daughter Patsy Patton the wife of John Patton now of Christian County I have give that portion of my estate which I do to her To my son Benjamin Patton I bequeath two hundred acres of land on the south side of Green river in Henderson County this land is part of a purchase made at the sale of my fathers estate of five hundred acres which is to be
