was returned to Court by Richard Young the
Executor examined and ordered to record

○ August first 1804. Bearing in mind that
it is appointed to all men once to die. I James
Lockhart of Jepamine County and state of
Kentucky do make and ordain this my last will
and Testament as follows Viz. First It is my will
that all my just debts and funeral expenses be
paid by my Executors hereafter to be appointed.
2nd I Give and bequeath to my son Silas Lockhart
eighty eight acres of Land The place I live, inclu-
ding the improvements and extending to the upper
end of the survey. provided he will maintain my
unfortunate Daughter Elizabeth Lockhart, if he
decline or refuse to comply with this it is my
will that the above quantity of Land be rented
not for the maintainance of said Daughter. And
at her death to be sold and equally divided among
the whole of my Children. It is my will that if
my Son Silas do maintain my said Daughter
during her life, that the above Land be to him and
his heirs forever. It is my will that the remainder
of my Land being about forty acres part of the
Purchase out of Terrys Survey be sold and the
money equally divided among Martha Jane
and Ruth Lockhart.

I Bequeath to my Daughter

Rebeckah Lockhart my gray mare and Cow and her
Priding. I Bequeath to my Daughter Sarah Lockhart
the sucking colt of said mare with all the cattle
that have been called hers and also the bedding
in her name. I Bequeath to my son Silas Lockhart
+ my Bay mare and yearling colt, also a cow and
calf. I Bequeath to the use of my Daughter
Elizabeth Lockhart my bed and bedding.

It is my will that all the money which
may remain after the above appropriations
from debts due me or otherwise be equally
divided among the whole of my Children.

It is my Will that all the property of every
kind unappropriated above be to the support
of the Family which may remain on the
plantation and in particular my Daughter
Elizabeth. And lastly I constitute and
appoint James Johnson James Dunwiddie and
Roger Patton Executors of this my last will and
Testament. Henceby revoking all former wills
the date above. Signed sealed in the
