I John Gilmore of Jopamine County And state of Kentucky Being low in health but in perfect mind & Memory and I knowing it is ordained for all men once to die I do ordain this my last will and Testament. And I do hereby Appoint Richard Young and Caleb McDowell my Executors. Item 1st it is my Express will and desire, that my Negro man slave named Solomon, shal be Christianized and set free

Item 2nd I give and bequeath unto my Beloved sister Martha wife of Josiah W. Burton one boy Mare about seven years old. Item 3rd I give and unto my beloved sister Sarah wife of Andrew McCampbell one dark Brown Mare which a bold face 5 years old. & her colt Item 4th I give and bequeath unto my Nephew John Burton son of Martha and Josiah W. Burton one hundred pounds to be paid out on Interest untill he comes of age. 5th Item I give and bequeath unto my Nephew John McCampbell son of Sarah & Andrew McCampbell one Hundred pounds to be put out on Interest untill he arrives at 21 years of age. 6th Item I give and bequeath unto my Nephew John McCampbell son of Oliver and James James McCampbell one Hundred pounds to be put out on

Interest untill he is of age. Item 7th I give and bequeath unto my Nephew John Simpson son of Elizabeth and Robert Simpson one Hundred pounds to be put out on Interest untill he is of age.

Item 8th I give and bequeath unto my Beloved sister Martha wife of Josiah W. Burton Eliza wife of James McCampbell, Sarah wife of Andrew McCampbell Elizabeth wife of Robert Simpson Jane wife of John G. Taylor and Susan a wife of Samuel Sand. all the residues of my Estate Real and personal

after my Just Debts are paid. to be Equally divided between them. Item 9th I give and bequeath unto my beloved sister Eliza wife of James McCampbell the crop that is now growing on my land. Item 10th and lastly it is my will and desire that my old corn now on hand should be sold. and applied to the payment of my debts. And in testimony hereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this fifteenth Day of June 1807

Lockhart of Jepamine County and state of
Kentucky do make and ordain this my last will
and Testament as follows Viz First It is my will
that all my just debts and funeral expenses be
paid by my Executors hereafter to be appointed.
2nd I Give and bequeath to my son Silas Lockhart
eighty eight acres of Land The place I live inclu-
ding the improvements and extending to the upper
end of the survey provided he will maintain my
unfortunate Daughter Elizabeth Lockhart, if he
decline or refuse to comply with this it is my
will that the above quantity of Land be rented
not for the maintenance of said Daughter. And
at her death to be sold and equally divided among
the whole of my Children. It is my will that if
my Son Silas do maintain my said Daughter
during her life, that the above Land be to him and
his heirs forever. It is my will that the remainder
of my Land being about forty acres part of the
Purchase out of Terrys Survey be sold and the
money equally divided among Martha Jane
and Ruth Lockhart.

I Bequeath to my Daughter

Rebeckah Lockhart my gray mare and Cow and her
Priding. I Bequeath to my Daughter Sarah Lockhart
the sucking colt of said mare with all the cattle
that have been called hers and also the bedding
in her name. I Bequeath to my son Silas Lockhart
+ my Bay mare and yearling colt, also a cow and
calf. I Bequeath to the use of my Daughter
Elizabeth Lockhart my bed and bedding.

It is my will that all the money which
may remain after the above appropriations
from debts due me or otherwise be equally
divided among the whole of my Children.

It is my Will that all the property of every
kind unappropriated above be to the support
of the Family which may remain on the
plantation and in particular my Daughter
Elizabeth. And lastly I constitute and
appoint James Johnson James Dunwiddie and
Roger Patton Executors of this my last will and
Testament. Henceby revoking all former wills
