Now I give and bequeath unto my son Samuel all that tract of land lying on the north side of the east fork of Jepson Creek together with my tan yard and the low of ground around it being a separate purchase from my other land on the north side of the B. I give my son William the several tracts of land hereinafter mentioned To wit One small tract I purchased of George Welch and other land purchased of Anthony Leakey being the place

whenever I now live amounting to about two hundred and nine acres Item 3^d I give to my two daughters Polly and Nancy four hundred acres of land lying on Hogs fork in Jefferson County to be equally divided between them paying respect to the quality Item 4th I give to my daughter Elizabeth all that tract of land lying in the following bounds on the south side of the east fork of Sepamine being two separate purchases of abner porter & the other of John elofs beginning at John Wards corner thence with Douglass line to Gannetts corner thence with Gannetts line to Hoss corner thence with Hoss line to elds corner thence her line to the said east fork thence up the same with the said creek to the beginning Item 5th I give to my wife Ellice during her widowhood all the rents issues & profits arising from farms & homestead for the support her & the children and educating them I give also to my said wife all the stock of every kind together with the house and

Kitchen furniture and farming utensils If she marries in that case she is to have the one third part of the rents of the land and stock of horses & cattle house and Kitchen furniture during her life and at her death to be equally divided between the the children It is my desire that my estate should be kept together and no part sold unless there should not be a sufficiency for the support of the family arising from the benefit of the farms Item 6th I give to my son Samuel a negro man named Cinner a negro boy Ben. as soon as he shall arrive to the age of twenty one years Item 7th I give to my son William a negro man named Joe and a negro boy named Harry when he comes of age Item 8 I give to my wife a negro man named James to her then her heirs the balance of my negroes It is my desire they be equally divided between my daughters at the several times of their coming of age or marrying It is desire I do hereby direct my Executors hereinafter mentioned to make sale of the stock of cattle now on hand for cash as soon as the nature of the case will admit of it to collect my debts and settle the

The money arising from the sale aforesaid and the money collected to purchase lands adjoining the land yard but if such purchase can't be made or if made there should be a balance the remaining of the money in either case the money to be equally divided between my wife and children the children part to be put to be put to interest and paid them as the come of age If there should be a purchase made of the lands adjoining the land yard I give the said lands to my son Samuel but if the addition made by said purchase exceed one hundred fifty acres the difference to be taken from the lower end of tract given above to the said I by this will give to my Daughter Elizabeth. I do appoint my wife - Alice Jacob Tookhunter & George Walker Executors to this my last will and testament In Testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 5th April 1802.
