claims her own I reserve only two negroes
Tom and Eve for the support of my wife -
while she lives and at her decease to be sold
with my other property and an equal di-
vide to be made among all my children
Joseph, Samuel, Alexander Wm, Squire, Mary
Rachael Margaret & Elizabeth.

And I do hereby constitute and ordain
this my last will and testament and do
make and disannul every other will.

In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 3^d day of March one thousand eight hundred and eight.
