

The last will and testament of Marten Dickinson, being of perfect mind & memory It is my will and desire that my body be decently interred & my soul resigned to the will of my being —
 In primis after all my just debts & funeral expences are paid It is my will & desire that my estate be divided among my Children after my death in the following manner, 1st my will beloved Wife is to retain possession of the land on which I now live during her life, or in case she marry during her Widowhood, I also give to her her legal share of my negroes and personal estate during her Widowhood or life if she do not marry the rest of my personal estate to be for the use of my three youngest Children. I give to my son in law David Jackson & his Wife Nancy the land on which they live or all the land on which lies on that side of the road leading from near Jn^o Scot's to Coldwely mill as their full share of all my estate — in line of the land where David Dickinson lives & for my said Daughter Nancys legacy & to their heirs. I give to my son David Dickinson the land on which he lives which he is to receive a deed for from David Jackson to him & his heirs. I give to my sons Lewis Dickinson & George Dickinson all that part of my land which lies west of a line mentioned in a bond

uniting giving to Lewis Dickinson & south of the road a/s. to be equally divided between them according to quantity & quality to them and there heirs forever I give to son William Dickinson & Fountain Dickinson that part of my land whereon I live & my son William lives to be equally divided between them according to quantity & quality & improvement to them & there heirs forever — It is my will that my out lands be divided among all my Children equally except my Daughter Nancy Jackson who has her full share. I give to my Daughter Fanny McBlair & her heirs the negro girl Betty now in her possession I give to my Daughter Polly & her heirs my negro girl Dinah — I give to my daughter Patsy & her heirs my negro girl Leah The rest of my negroes to be equally divided among my sons, Lewis George, William & David as well as any other property not herein particularly disposed of In Witness whereof I have hereunto sett my hand & seal this 21st day of July 1810 — Marten Dickinson

 Testament. that is to say first of all I give and
 Recommend my soul unto the hands of God
 that gave it. and as to my Body I recommend
 to a Decent Christian Burial at the Discretion
 of my Executors, hoping that I shall receive
 the same at the Resurrection by the almighty

power of God and also such worldly Estate where with it has
 pleased God to bless me with in this life. I devise and Dispose
 of in following manner and form in the first place
 it is my will and I Do Devise that all my Just Debts which
 are but few and small. shall be paid and satisfied
 Item I Give and bequeath unto my will be loved wife
 Sarah Hunter one bay horse five years old Also my
 also my stock of cattle sheep and hogs and their
 Increase and all my farming tools and also all my
 house hold and kitchen furniture. During her
 natural life or widowhood - Item I Give unto
 my two sons by my present present wife Sarah
 Hunter two colts to wit to my son Nathan Hunter
 I Give one sorrel colt with a small star to him
 and his Heirs for Ever I also Give unto my son Henry
 Hunter one sorrel mare colt a bayed face to him
 and his Heirs for Ever Item it is my will and Desire
 that the rest of my horse beasts shall be sold by
 Executors and the money arising from the sale
 of them shall be loaned at Interest. (turn over)
 untill my two sons Nathan Hunter Henry Hunter
 shall come of age and when they become of age
 it is my will I desire that the money so loaned out
 and the Interest shall be collected and Equally
 divided between my two sons Nathan Hunter
 & Henry Hunter - if they should have become
 of age at the time - if not the Dory bequeathed
 my wife with the Increase shall be sold and
 the money arising from the sale thereof shall
 be Equally Divided between my two sons Nathan
 and Henry when they shall become of age
 Item it is also my will and desire that my
 wife shall give my two sons Nathan and
