 Davis I bequeth to him his Bond amounting to  
 upwards of Two hundred dollars as an equivalent  
 for my wife Francis living at his House. Lastly  
 I make and ordain my wife Francis Executrix  
 and my friend Robert Coleman of Christian  
 County Executor of this my last Will and Testament  
 hereby disavowing and Revoking all former Wills and  
 Codicils made by me in witness where of I have hereunto  
 set my hand and seal this Twelfth day of the

I will that all my just Debt be Discharged as soon as convenient after my Decease & that as much of my estate as is necessary to pay my proportionable part of the expenses of the said Suit And Depending with Green Day shall be appropriated therunto, I will that agreeable to an article entered into with my in other all my land shall be sold as soon as convenient & the money put to interest and that interest to be for my mothers support During her Life; and at my mothers Death my part of the principle as mentioned in sd article to be equally divided among my Sisters Hannah Scott Sally Holmes Vacey Gaily, and Brothers Hugh Scott Sam Scott and my Brother William Scott son Simon — I also will bequeath to my sister Hannah Scott one third of the money arising from the sale of my other property, the other two third for the payment of my Debt & the use of my Mother. I do hereby appoint Brother Hugh Scott Hugh Holmes & my uncle Thomas Scott Executors of this my last will & testament, in witness whereof I have herunto set my hand & seal this 22<sup>nd</sup> day of February in the year 1871
