knowing the mutability of human nature
do constitute and ordain this my last will
and testament. In the first place, it is my
will and desire that all my just debts be
paid out of my estate. 2^d It is my will
and desire after my death that my father
and mother and mother in law and keep
in possession the four and one half
lots that were in the town of Chickasaw
lying and being on main street and
whereon the family now lives also and
negro man named Pile together with
two mares and a colt and all the house
hold and kitchen furniture now in
the possession of family; all which I lend
to my said father Benjⁿ Netherland
and my mother Theodora Netherland
during their pleasure or natural lives
after which it is my will and desire that an
equal division of the a^d property be
made between my surviving brothers
John & Benjaⁿ Netherland and my sister

443 Mary Ann and Mary Ann and their heirs
forever. It is further my will and desire that
Archibald Bogan keep my negro man Pile
during this year, and for the hire of him
for said year he pay the Henry King of said
County \$40 for hire of negro woman, also
\$25 to Thomas Payne for the hire of a negro
boy now in the possession of the family the
remaining \$15 for the hire of Pile he
pay towards clothing of 5 negroes or to
family if said negroes are furnished with clothing
I solemnly rebuke and disannul all and
every other will or wills heretofore made
by me and constitute this my last will
and testament. And appoint my friend
John Metcalf as my sole executor this
my last will testament. Given under
my hand this 27th day of July 1873.
