As death is certain lot of all men I Roger Patton do make and ordain this my last will and testament in order and it is my will that all my just debts and funeral charges be paid out of my estate by my Executors To my daughter Patsy Patton the wife of John Patton now of Christian County I have give that portion of my estate which I do to her To my son Benjamin Patton I bequeath two hundred acres of land on the south side of Green river in Henderson County this land is part of a purchase made at the sale of my father's estate of five hundred acres which is to be

divided according to quantity of soils. I will the
above quantity to Benjamin to his heirs forever
To my son James Patton I bequeath two hundred
acres of land off the south side of the survey where
I now live to include the spring and cobbins where
the Thrapp have lived the line to be extended in
such a way as to include the quantity of 200 acres
to be bounded by Hittes to line to the south to
him and to his heirs forever

To my Daughters Margaret Patton, Sarah,
Elizabeth and my sons William, John &
Matthew I bequeath to each of these an equal
quantity of my estate

It is my will that my children be ~~should~~ supported out of my property. And whereas it may be necessary that as the children arrive at age of or if they should marry at an earlier period that they be put in possession of such a part as may ^{be} due. I give & share my executors are directed to pay such

It is my will that my Negro woman party be sold together with as large part of my personal property reserving what may be necessary for the use of the family so long as they keep house.

It is discovered that house keeping is impracticable
for my family. They must be provided for in such
some way as my Parents

289 may Judge convenient, when this takes place if
at all it is my will that the moore of property for
house keeping be sold. And I submit to the discre-
-tion of my Executors whether the land on which I
have lived exclusive of the part of the present debt
is to my own family will be disposed of immediately
or rented out to support my family untill the
younger children will arrive at age, I do direct
that the 450 acres, the remainder of the pre-
-sent one half of which is devised to my son Benjamin
-ing be under the control of my Executors in the
same manner my land in Bulbit County, I
place in the same situation my land in Galatia
County is under the same direction, a claim of land
of ~~some~~ I have in Tuscul County of 200 acres which
is involved in a lawsuit if gained is to be under
the same regulation, my son manabacop is to assist
in providing for my family while they remain
together and if they separate he may be hired out
for their benefit, It is my will that this servant
be treated humanely and if by disease or accident
he be rendered unfit for labour he is to be supported
from my estate. My 4 children the seven last mentioned
are to have an equal division of the property that will
remain after the expence of supporting them is paid
my Executors are to sell all my land which are not
appropriated by this will and any one of them is
hereby authorized to make deeds to any of my lands
