 Jefferson County and State of Kentucky, being
 of a sound mind, memory, reason, and understand-
 ing, and calling to mind the mortality of my
 body, knowing it is appointed for all men to die,
 do make, ordain, Ratify and declare this to be
 my last will & testament, first I commit my
 body to the earth to be buried in a plain decent and
 Christian like manner, And after my funeral
 expences, and all my lawful debts are paid,
 do dispose of the Remaining part of my estate
 in the following manner. I do give and bequeath
 to my loving wife Sarah Walters all my estate
 both real and personal during her natural
 life except one three year old bay mare and
 one two year old bay mare two Cows and
 two beds and furniture which I give and
 bequeath in the following manner (Viz)

To my daughter Betty wife of Thomas
 Edwards I give and bequeath the above men-
 tioned two year old bay mare and a certain
 Cow now in her possession. Also a bed and
 furniture which is also in her possession

And to my daughter Pally wife of Joel Bryan
 I give and bequeath the above mentioned three
 year old bay mare One Cow and one bed and
 furniture. And with respect to a debt that
 is due to me from John Freeman. I provide
 that the said Freeman should get a suffi-
 ciency of salt water to carry on the salt making
 business, I direct and require my executors to apply
 the yearly income that will be coming from the
 said John Freeman to the use of the Education of
 my Children or so much thereof as they may
 think necessary. I also require and direct my
 my loving wife Sarah Walters By and with
 the consent of my Executors, to give to each
 of my Daughters when they marry as much
 of my personal Estate as I have bequeathed
 to my two oldest daughters, And at the death
 of my wife I direct that my Executors sell
 my land and personal Estate and divide the
 money equally between my sons Sampson
 Walters Samuel Walters, John Walters Fran-
 cis Walters and Luke Walters. Lastly I

nominate and appoint Samuel Davis and Samuel Morrow both of Jefferson County my sole Executors of this my last will and testament hereby revoking and disannulling all former wills and testaments by me hereof made. In testimony whereof I hereunto set my hand and seal this Eleventh day of June one thousand Eight hundred and four

I give and bequeath unto my wife Ann during her life the following Negroes Lattice James Long Thomas also I give unto my wife Ann all my stock of every description together with my household & Kitchen furniture during her life I give and bequeath unto my daughter Sarah Hunt after the death of my wife my negro man Sam to her & her heirs I give and bequeath unto my daughter Nancy Macey a Negro Boy Jeremiah until Radford Macey arrives at the age of twenty one years & the S^r negro Jeremiah when the S^r Radford shall be 21 years in remainder forever to him & his heirs I give & bequeath unto my daughter Martha Ewan a negro boy Clement during her life and then when S^r boy Clement to go to Rachel Smith Ewan also I give my daughter Martha my negro woman after the death of my wife named Lattice during the life of my S^r daughter & at her death this negro woman to go to Nancy Ewan I give and bequeath unto my son James Williams after the death of my wife my negro woman Chellico & her future increase I give & bequeath unto my grand son Malheur Williams after the death of my wife my negro Thomas also after the death
