To my Daughter Eliza and Young I leave to each Bed and furniture and ten Dollars in cash at my wife's Marriage or Decease which comes first, all the remainder of my estate is to be equally divided among my Children each one to have this Legal Quota and I do appoint the following persons my Executors my wife Maryann John Ellumbaugh and John Hunter, and this I maintain to be my last will and testament Given under my hand and seal this 3^d day of March 1806

Negro man by the name of Moses & my riding
horse & saddle.

Item. I give & bequeath to my Mother &
all the rest of my tuesday & morning if in
case the funds should hold out & if in case they
should be any funds left I give it to mother for
her to do with it as she should see cause.

Item. I give & bequeath to my nephew & my cousin
Aquila my watch & saddle.

Lastly I do hereby constitute & appoint my brother law
Charles Barnes & son of this my last will & testament.
